Husband of Mrs. Lucille Kluge Zagala of R. U. 14, Mo. Flight Officer J. L. Zagala is believed to have been killed on a mission as first pilot of a C-47 over the New Guinea area in October, 1943, when he was previously reported missing in action. Lt. Joseph R. Zagala, 45, brother, gave his life in Italy July 10, 1943. He was serving with the Rangers. Besides the parents and wife, there are no other survivors.

### Keep up Fight on TB National Leader Asks

"There are 300 people in Monroe County alive today who would have died last year of tuberculosis if all of the forces to prevent tuberculosis had not been so well organized." This was the statement made by Will Ross, President of the National Tuberculosis Association, who was the chief speaker at the Annual Meeting of the Tuberculosis and Health Association of Rochester and Monroe County, Inc. last Thursday, June 8 at the Chamber of Commerce.

"That is a good record, but it is still not good enough," declared Mr. Ross, stating that tuberculosis kills more people annually in the United States than all of the other communicable diseases combined. It is responsible for one death every six minutes in this country. We have at our command the necessary means for eradicating tuberculosis," he pointed out.
