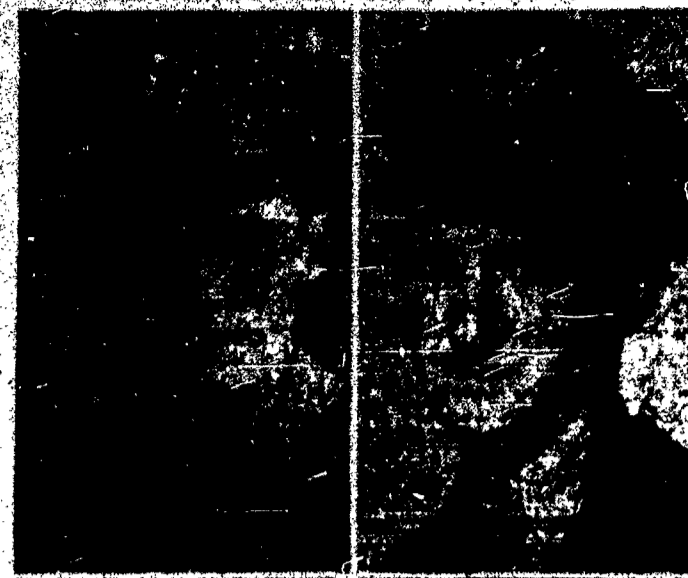

Manchuria Missions Active But Need Help

O'CONNOR, Missionary - N.Y. - Flying into Manchuria in a party of United States newspaper correspondents, I find Catholic missions still vigorous in their efforts to save souls in the last year of Chinese Nationalist and Communist armies now fight within 100 miles of us, but the only evidence of war here are abandoned encampments at street corners, the 200 p. m. curfew, and Chinese soldiers patrolling the deserted city on foot and on horse. Apparently, Russian troops evacuated the country, leaving the port city of Dairen, vacant.

Throughout the Japanese war years, the Russian occupation, Chinese communist hordes, and civil war the Chinese needed to have escaped large-scale losses. But the tribles have been many. I asked Rev. Bishop John Maria Shea, Vicar Apostolic of Mukden, why he felt that this vicar of the Paris Foreign Missions Society of a heart's content a heart's content.

Last winter, one priest and five nuns died of typhus contracted while serving for Japanese soldiers. During the recent battle for Siping, the headquarters of Canadian missionaries, the seminary building was badly damaged by shell fire. In Changchun, Manchuria's capital, heavy cap-
