Flooded Elmira Church Cleared By Volunteers

The job of removing mud and debris left behind in the buildings of St. Peter and Paul's parish, Elmira by the flood waters of the swollen Chemung River is rapidly being accomplished.

Through the untiring efforts of men and women of the parish, and the local Knights of Columbus Council, the cleaning up of the church school, rectory and convent basements is well on the way to completion, the Rev. William Naughton, pastor, reports.

Following an appeal by Father Naughton for help in clearing the debris-filled basements, over two dozen women appeared at the church door with mops, pails, and scrub brushes.

Scrubbing and polishing for three afternoons, the delegation of workers had removed every trace of the flood in the church after three afternoons.

According to Father Naughton, a stranger going through the building could not have been convinced that a flood had almost covered the pews with damaging waters only a few days before.

The task of digging out the boiler rooms of the church and school, and the basements of the convent and rectory was accomplished through the efforts of a group of parishioners and men obtained through the Knights of Columbus.

Despite flood problems of their own, these men turned out to help the pastor for four nights in the rectory also. They removed tons of debris, mostly heavy gravel washed in when part of the cellar wall collapsed.

Trustees Frank O'Dea and William Bennett supervised the recovery work and Frank Rohde, Grand Knight of Elmira Council, Knights of Columbus, enlisted workers from other parishes. Trucks for removing the debris were supplied by William Hammer.

Father Naughton offered a Mass of Thanksgiving Tuesday for every man and woman whose labor accomplished much of the restoration of St. Peter and Paul's.

Mrs. Anna Marks' Rites Conducted

Solemn funeral services for Mrs. Anna M. Marks, 69, mother of a priest and a nun, were conducted Saturday, May 23, 1946, in Holy Apostles Church, Rochester.

Mother of the Rev. Francis A. Marks, of the St. Andrew's Seminary faculty, and Sister Patricia Ann of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph, Elmira, Mrs. Marks died Wednesday, May 22, 1946, in her home, 10 Placid Pl. She had been in poor health for a year.

Father Marks offered the Solemn Requiem Mass, assisted by the Rev. George V. Predmore, as deacon, and the Rev. Joseph G. Merkel, as subdeacon. Minor offices of the Mass were served by St. Andrew's seminarians.

During the past week Elmira has again been hard hit by 3 electrical storms. The electricity and power were cut off in the hospital. Emergency lighting systems worked automatically and filled an urgent need as an operation was in progress and was successfully finished during the storm.

The Sisters are deeply appreciative of the magnificent assistance given by the people of Elmira during the flood and after. City officials, the Fire Department, New York State Authority, the Elmira Reformatory, Mark Twain Hotel, hospital employees, numerous business concerns and volunteer workers helped unstintingly during the trying days. To all of these the St. Joseph's Hospital Board, the Staff and the Sisters extend their gratitude.

Evidence of the flood and destruction is still great. Work of rehabilitation is steadily in progress. Reconstructed gear forward in the boiler room, kitchen, tray room, physical therapy department, cafeteria, auditorium, operating room, transformer room and other units. Painting and decorating because of cracking and flaking plaster is impossible at the present time.
