Bread! Bread! Cry Living Skeletons In Czech Camps

London, England — (AP) — "Distressing conditions in the Czechoslovak internment camps, filled with many thousands of men, women and children, most of them Catholics, are depicted in eyewitness reports reaching here."

The reports, which are being received from the German-speaking minority who are to be expelled from the former Sudeten area, their homeland for many centuries.

While general conditions vary from camp to camp, depending on the decency — or lack of it — of the camp commanders, hunger is the prevailing condition everywhere.

Particularly shocking conditions have been observed in several smaller camps, where the inmates were found to be "like living skeletons, with pallid and almost yellow skin, ridden with vermin, more like animals than human beings."

Rations consist of black coffee in the morning and thin soup with a piece of bread in the evening.

The people do not ask for luxuries, all they desire is a larger piece of bread," one report says. "Bread, bread, is the daily cry of the children, of the women, of the men."

Hunger is the most frequent cause of death in the camps and there is no possibility of help for the many victims of tuberculosis.

Other reports, which fail to investigate the actual situation, are made by national and international commissions inspecting these camps; the reports charge.

Many of the inmates have been shunted from one camp to the other, the reports say. The case of two women, who were found in their fifteenth camp is cited. Bit by bit, they had lost their health and are now completely incapacitated.

A considerable number of the inmates were professional persons who had been of considerable means and high standing: teachers, professors, engineers and others.

In most camps, shelter is crude and insufficient, offering little or no protection against rain or cold.

The brutal methods of Nazi camps are still carried on here, one report says, adding that "in the small camps many have died unknown. And the facts are unreported. Others show the mark of beating and maltreatment."

IRISH PRIMATE IS INSTALLED

Dublin — (AP) — The Most Rev. John D'Alton was installed as Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of All Ireland with impressive ceremonies at St. Patrick's Cathedral in his See city of Armagh.

Although the town of Armagh is located in that section of the Province of Ulster, which, under the terms of the 1801 Act, is politically a part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain, many hundreds of priests and members of the Irish had come from all quarters of the green isle to witness the enthronement, thus testifying to a spiritual unity that cannot be impaired by political boundary lines.

Archbishop D'Alton, who was Bishop of the neighboring Diocese of Meath before being named to succeed the late John Cardinal MacCarthy, presented the Papal Bull of appointment to the Chair of the Cathedral Chapter, who had gathered in the Synodal Hall. He was then conducted by solemn procession to the gates of St. Patrick's, where he was greeted by Messrs. MacDonald of Dungannon, Dean of Armagh, who has been Vicar Capitular since Cardinal MacCarthy's death eight months ago.

The new Primate then proceeded to the High Altar where the enthronement took place. Archbishop D'Alton took face well from his feet in the Diocese of Meath at the crowded Cathedral of Christ the King in Mullingar, whose construction will always be associated with the memory of the late John Cardinal Glennon of St. Louis.
