Soldier Death Confirmed By War Dept.

T Sgt. Earl T. Switzer, 450 Clay Ave. reported missing in action in August, 1943, has been officially reported killed in action on July 26, 1943, in the European area according to a letter from the War Department to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Robert E. Switzer. He was killed when a Flying Fortress went down.

Sergeant Switzer was employed at Eastman Kodak Company prior to his entry into the Army and was in the 8888 Central Postal Directory in England in June, 1943. His family are parishioners in Sacred Heart Cathedral parish and he attended St. Charles Borromeo School.

Besides his parents, Sgt. Switzer is survived by two brothers, Gerald and Roger, and his grandmother, Mrs. John Donoghue.

Ask Librarians To Join Fight On Delinquency
