200 Midnight Masses Draw 120,000 to Paris

Paris — (RNS) — Two hundred Masses are celebrated at 200 altars placed on the grassy arena of the Olympic Stadium of Colombes, near Paris, on the night of June 29-30. The Cardinal Archbishop of Paris officiated at the same time on an elevated balcony at one end of the Stadium, and all the celebrants turned toward him, accompanied exactly his movements. These celebrants were priests of the 200 parishes of the Archdiocese.

It was an extraordinary spectacle, and perhaps unique in history, this sight of 200 priests elevating the Sacred Host with the same gesture at the moment of the Consecration.

The spectacle could hardly have been more moving, from the entrance into the Stadium of 200 altars carried by the children of the choir, following the vicar in surplices and the curia in chasubles.

The occasion of this extraordinary ceremony was the farewell of the Archdiocese of Paris to the Virgin of Boulogne. It is known that the statue of Our Lady of Boulogne has been venerated since an age long past in the region of the north of France. According to that tradition, the Virgin in the year 638 had appeared to some fishermen, she was standing in a boat entering the port of Boulogne. From Paris to Paris.

Three years ago the statue was carried to Lourdes. It came back in a cart which the men and women of the cities and towns pulled barefooted on its way. Thus it was honored from parish to parish, coming at last to Paris and remaining there more than six months.

When all the parishes of Paris had been visited the faithful met for a ceremony of adieu at her exit from the diocese. The parish of Colombes was chosen because it had the largest Stadium of the Parisian region. Each of the parishes, even the most distant, sent a delegation of several hundreds persons. Certain parishes sent up to 4,000.

The processional entrance of the parishes into the arena, and into the rising tiers of seats, to the chant of hymns and litanies, lasted nearly three hours and a half.

Jesuits To Elect New Superior General

Rome — (RNS) — A general congregation of the Society of Jesus will be held in Rome September 7 to elect a new Superior General of the Jesuit order in succession to Father Vladimir Ledochowski, who died in 1942.

The Society of Jesus is at present under the direction of the Very Rev. Norbert de Boynes, S.J., a 69-year-old Frenchman, who was named to the post of vicar general in April 1944. His appointment followed the death of the Rev. Alessio Magni, S.J., who had been nominated as temporary director by Father Ledochowski a few days before the latter's death.


