Carmel Undamaged Among Lisieux Ruins

Lisieux, France — (NC) — In the oldest Gothic church in Normandy, the "pink" choir of eight-hundred-harmonized officiating priest on Pentecost Sunday, seated in the choir of St. Pierre's Cathedral here, they played Obey-Vindicta's Mass of St. Hubert, patron of hunters on hunting horns.

La Duchette de Paris, a group of French and Belgian champions in the sounding of calls to the hunt, some dating from the sixteenth century, had come to Lisieux at the invitation of the local St. Hubert's Hunt Club, to give two concerts for the benefit of those who suffered and died during the days of "red" and "black" liberation.

Usually the St. Hubert's Mass is sung in the fall, at the beginning of the hunting season, and the hounds are bleated after the Mass. After the Mass on Pentecost Sunday, the huntmen assembled on the steps of the Cathedral, in their red coats, white breeches and black boots and jockey caps, while the champions blew their horns, and beneath them stretched out into the distance a reminder of why such benefit concerts were necessary.

Lisieux is one of a number of Norman communities where freedom was recovered at a terrible toll in the loss of life and property, and the extraordinary number of cripples one sees on the streets is a constant reminder that not all died, but many were maimed.

The cathedral where Bishop Cauchon built the Lady Chapel in explanation, it is said, for his part in the condemnation of St. Joan of Arc — escaped unscathed, but it stands on the rim of blocks and blocks of utter desolation. On the other side of the market place of Lisieux, which may have served as a fire-gap, thus preserving this ancient edifice, not one building remains of what was once a hazy, narrow street, almost allays, lined with shops of every description.

Not all of Lisieux is destroyed, it is true. There is still a substantial fringe of dwellings, but even here home life is disrupted. No one can boast of a parlor, living room or guest room, for rooms as well as food and everything else are rationed. But not hopelessly! I have been entertained in a home where two families now live, although formerly one occupied it when entertainment was on a lavish scale.

And amid all the ruins, one may still visit the Carmel and completely lose sight, and all though of the desolation outside. For the adjacent church, and the special chapel containing the shrine of the Little Flower, of Lisieux, are all just as I saw them in 1938. Yet across the street, the walls still stand of the buildings where the chaplain, Monsignor Germain, and other clergymen resided, and where the months, Les Amalans de Lisieux, were published.
