years, but directed "to the kind of adult we want him to be," the speaker said.

Clara Four Principles

Four principles set forth by the Jesuit educator were: Read to fill the mind; Discuss the high point with someone else; Think and evaluate; Choose the best thought and put it to use.

Mrs. Ruth Evans Babcock, supervisor of School Libraries, State Education Department, Albany, said the director of a library is to supply children with books, work with teachers in advancing the principle, children learn to read by reading; invite by displaying attractive books, help pupils to form habits of study early in school life.

"Arouse a compelling interest in the pastors," was suggested by Sister M. Fidelis, a member of the library staff of the Catholic University of America, Washington, in discussing "Financing a Library in a Catholic Elementary School."

Sister Fidelis recited many suggestions of ways and means for teachers to help themselves through appealing activities in building up libraries.
