### Patronal Feast of the Deaf To be Celebrated August 24

New Orleans — (NC) — The eleventh Sunday after Pentecost, which this year falls on August 25, is Ephpheta Sunday, the patronal feast of the deaf. The Rev. Joseph W. Heideck, C.S.S.R., recalls in a statement issued here that the feast of the deaf falls on the eleventh Sunday after Pentecost and is called Ephpheta Sunday because on the day the Gospel is read which relates the cure of a deaf and dumb man by Christ. Jesus said to the afflicted person: "Ephpheta," which according to the Gospel means, "Be thou opened."

And immediately his ears were opened and the Gospel continues, "and the string of his tongue was loosed, and he spoke right."

The origin of the feast, dates back to 1810 when Pope Pius X designated the eleventh Sunday after Pentecost as Ephpheta Sunday at the request of the late Archbishop Henry Moeller of Cincinnati. In a letter to the Holy Father, the Archbishop pointed out that there were about 17,000 deaf people in the United States at the time who were Catholics, adding that many were losing their faith because there were few priests or religious equipped to provide for their spiritual needs.

To encourage Catholics to devote themselves to the salvation of the deaf Archbishop Moeller requested the Holy Father to designate the eleventh Sunday after Pentecost as the patronal feast of the deaf, to grant a plenary indulgence at the hour of death to all who die during the year that they are working for the salvation of the deaf, to all who devote one year of their life to giving spiritual aid to the deaf, and to all the afflicted who enroll themselves at a Catholic mission for the deaf.
