

Most Polish Relief Needs Still Unfilled

Chicago — (NC) — The magnitude of the task which faces the A.M.E. fund, relief workers and social workers of the Catholic welfare agency Caritas in downtown Chicago, was described in the Polish-Hungary of the Chicago syndicate in an address here by Magr. Marcel Fokals, apostolic vicar of the city.

Work with Boy Gangs Cited as Delinquency Curb

New York — (NC) — In dealings with boy gangs and their clubs as part of efforts to suppress delinquency among juveniles, G. Howard Shaw, former Assistant Secretary of State and League of Nations mediator, in a radio address Sunday on the Catholic Hour urged: "Let's do far less to gangs and far more with them and with the communities from which they come."

Mr. Shaw's address was part of the current series by Catholic laymen for the Catholic Hour, which is produced by the National Council of Catholic Men and Broadcast by the National Broadcasting Company. The former State Department official was awarded the 1945 League Medal for his work to reduce juvenile delinquency.

Summing up recommendations to communities, Mr. Shaw commended the work of a young Negro policeman in Washington, D.C., who founded what is known as the Junior Police and Citizens Corps. The policeman is Oliver A. Cowan.

"The Corps started," Mr. Shaw related, "when Officer Cowan was given an especially troublesome case and found himself confronted with widespread destructive gang activity. Instead of making wholesale arrests he got to know the gangs and culture of their leaders. Before long he had won their confidence. He secured better meeting places for each gang and with the assistance of storekeepers and other persons he was able to get athletic equipment and recreational facilities."

"The community soon got the idea that these were their boys and instead of condemning them or doing nothing about them they had better do something to help them, and the boys in due course got a very similar idea. The idea, as one boy put it, that 'this is our part of town and we're going to do something for it.'"

"They have street lamps are no longer smashed, glass windows are intact, alleys are being cleaned up, an open air summer has been built for the summer months on a vacant lot from which an untidy collection of junk has been removed, and a frame house has been acquired as headquarters and is being renovated partly by the boys themselves and partly by a project of the manual arts department of a nearby public school. This is an example of what can be done with gangs."

The features of Officer Cowan's program are incorporated in a three-year experimental project recommended by the Committee on Gangs of the Welfare Council of New York. The project, Mr. Shaw explained, has these three essentials: (1)

Recognition and acceptance of the gang; (2) Adult influence exerted indirectly through carefully chosen persons capable of winning the confidence of the gang and working with its members; and (3) Efforts to enlist the active interest and support of communities from which the gangs come, first of all in behalf of the immediate needs of the boys and eventually in meeting community problems of which the anti-social gang is but one manifestation.
