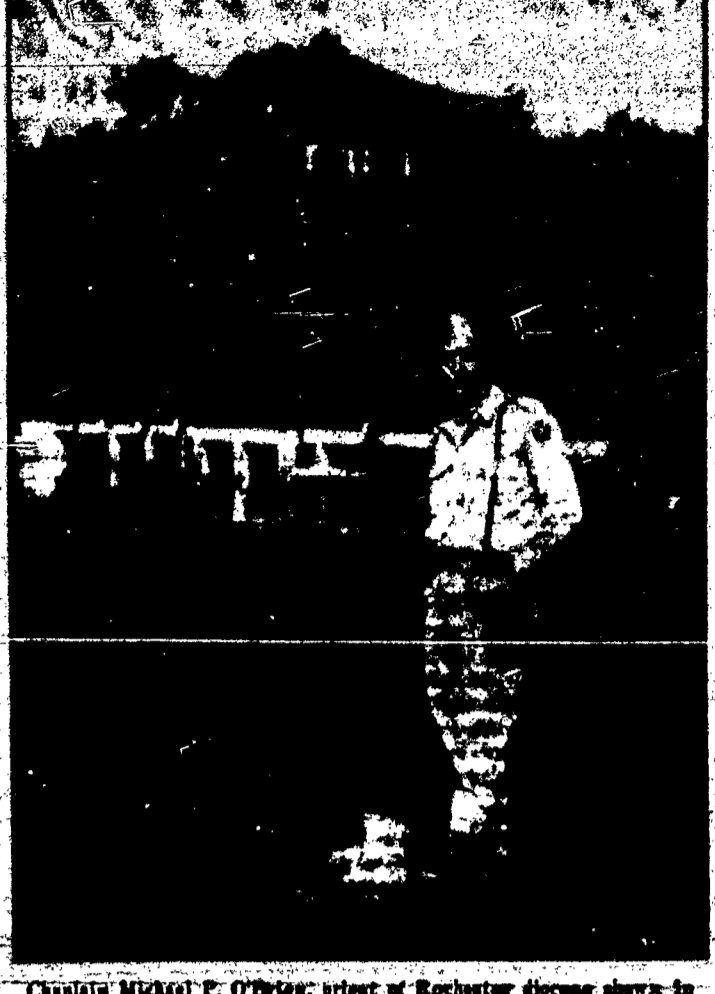

 Creation of a Medival Institute at the University of Notre Dame here has been announced by the Rev. Hugh J. O'Donnell, C.S.C., president. The director of the institute will be the Very Rev. Dr. Gerald E. Fogarty, who since 1937 has been president of the Pontifical Institute of Medival Studies in Toronto, Canada. In his announcement, Father O'Donnell said: "While developing the several fields of modern science and other fields of modern knowledge, Notre Dame is becoming aware of the need of preserving, fostering and developing traditional Catholic learning in theology, philosophy, history and the humanities, which are fundamental to all Catholic education.
