### Abp. Ritter Is Appointed to St. Louis See

Washington — (NC) — His Holiness Pope Pius XII has made appointments transferring an American Archbishop from one See to another and promoting an American Bishop to the rank of Archbishop. It is announced in word received here by His Excellency Archbishop Amleto Giovanni Cicognani, Apostolic Delegate to the United States.

The Most Rev. Joseph E. Ritter, Archbishop of Indianapolis, has been named Archbishop of St. Louis.

The Most Rev. Earl C. Schulte, Bishop of Louisville, has been named Archbishop of Indianapolis.

Archbishop Ritter was born in New Albany, Ind., in 1872. He is the son of Nicholas A. and Bertha Lucia Ritter. He attended St. Michael's Seminary in Indiana and was ordained to the priesthood in 1897.

### KKK Spying on K. of C. Reveals Membership List of 1,100 Secret

New York State this week outlawed the Ku Klux Klan amid revelations that an investigator from the Attorney General's office had won his way into the confidence of top-ranking Klansmen in the metropolitan area.

The order officially dissolving the Klan was issued by Supreme Court Justice Joseph A. Cavagan of New York County on application of Attorney General Nathan L. Goldstein.

The state investigator — posing as a Mr. Bauer — had only exposed the names of Klan leaders, but obtained a list of more than 1,100 members and linked the Klan chiefs to contacts in Georgia and other Southern states.

Mr. Goldstein also revealed that "Mr. Bauer" had been in contact with the Attorney General's office in New York County, at which time he instituted the anti-Klan proceedings.

## World Cannon Visits Moscow

The world's largest cannon, built by the Soviet Union, is being taken to Moscow for a visit.

## U. S. MAY USE STRIP HUNGARY

Washington — (NC) — Soviet Russia has been finally accused by 163 United States of creating economic chaos in Hungary by stripping it of vital raw materials.

The United States is said to be preparing to strip Hungary of raw materials if the Soviet government does not stop its economic warfare.

## Stolen Sacred Hosts Are Burned By Milan 'Demons' at 'Black Mass'

Rome — (RNS) — The sacred host was stolen recently from fourteen Roman Catholic churches in Milan, according to reports here. The thefts have been attributed to agents of a secret society called "Demons," headed by a priest known as the "Devil's Priest."

The society holds regular meetings in various Milan hotels at which hosts are burned at the conclusion of a "Black Mass."

The thefts followed a recent strong denunciation by Alfonso Cardinal Schuster, Archbishop of Milan, of "dangerous sects instituted to offend Christians."

Cardinal Schuster declared that actions of these sects are "all the more horrifying because in order to carry out their purposes they have allowed children, even going to the extent of inflicting them with drugs to help them steal hosts from churches."

Activities of the secret sect in Milan and surrounding villages are known to have begun several years ago, and were first condemned by Cardinal Schuster in 1931 when he issued several pastoral letters denouncing the theft of hosts from churches for profane purposes. He made similar protests in 1934 and 1935.
