Sodalities of Our Lady
Ideals and Norms

In this translation of the encyclical of Pope Pius XII to 4,000 Sodalities on his 65th anniversary to the Sodality of Our Lady, the Holy Mother of God (ideals and norms for sodalities).

Devotion — An Endless Gift
 "You have come with devoted thoughts, beloved sons and daughters, to commemorate the 75th anniversary of the Sodality of Our Lady, that of our consecration to the Most Holy Virgin in the Sodality of Our Lady, the Capranica. And our first word in welcoming you is to exclaim with all the fervor of Our grateful heart: 'O magnifica the Lord with me; and let us extol His name together' (Ps. 113:4).

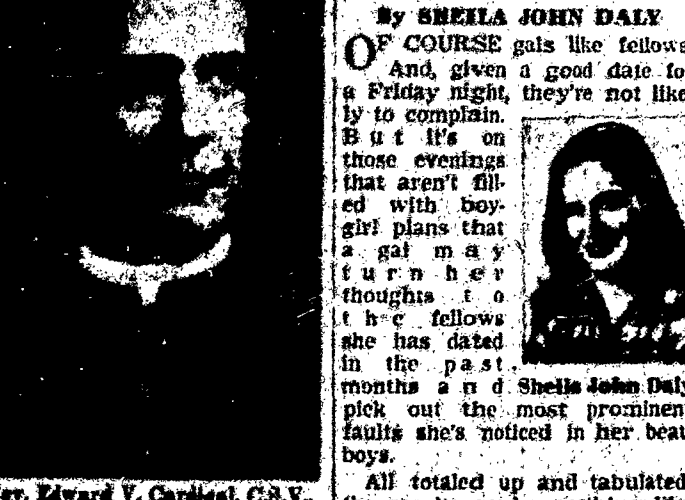
"Consecration to the Mother of God in the Sodality is an entire gift of oneself, throughout life. It is not a mere sentiment; it is not a mere formality; but it is operative, consummated in the consecration of the life of Christ and of Mary, in the apostolic life in which the Sodality fulfills the mission of Mary and, as to express it, her visible hands upon earth in the spontaneous offering of a supernatural interior life, which pours itself out in all of the exterior works of solid devotion, of works of charity and of zeal. It is in this which the first of your rules insinuates with special insistence.

Ideals — Purpose
 "To apply oneself seriously to sanctify each day in prayer, to practice oneself, in any manner whatsoever but with ardor, in the means and manner compatible with each one's social condition to the salvation and perfection of others; in a word, to employ oneself strenuously in the service of the Church of Christ; such is the assignment of the Sodality. Freely, voluntarily accepted in the act of consecration, such is the magnificent program traced out for him by the rules.

"In reality these rules have done nothing but express in precise terms and as it were 'codify' the history and the constant practice of the Sodality, which is essentially constituted by the well-merited Society of Jesus and approved and repeatedly and highly praised by the Holy See.

"We are far, as you see, from the concept of a simple union of quiet and inoperative piety, of a simple piety, which is not also from that of a simple league of nothing but external activity, feverish because artificial, and which can only stir up and set in motion a few straws, or more or less brief durations. 'Can a man hide fire in his bosom, and his garments not burn?' (Prov. 6:17). If that is true of dissipated human piety, how much more will it be true of the fire of charity, the flame of which the Holy Spirit arouses

LEFTIST TREND IN STUDENT MEET
