Purchased for Foreign Missions**

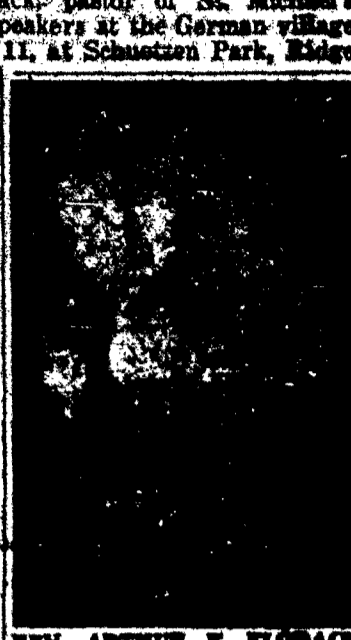
Medical equipment originally intended to help Rochester area residents meet the impact of enemy air raids in World War II has been purchased for use of Catholic missionaries in foreign fields.
