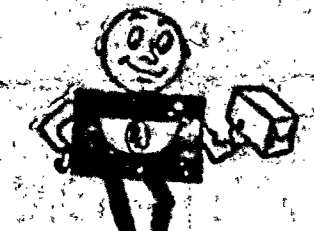
## NATIONAL NCCM OFFICERS HERE

## Civilian Defense Medical Supplies Purchased for Foreign Missions

Medical equipment originally intended to help Rochester area residents meet the impact of enemy attacks in World War II has been purchased for use of Catholic missionaries in foreign fields. Arranged by the Rev. John S. Randall, director of the Diocesan Office of the Society for Propagation of the Faith, the purchase included eleven cases of office of Civilian Defense casualty kits valued at \$4,400. The kits were sold at a discount to the Catholic Medical Mission Board under a new program introduced by the War Assets Administration for on-the-spot buying of surplus war properties by non-profit institutions. The Catholic Medical Mission Board has already obtained large quantities of scarce and badly needed medical supplies under the same program for distribution to foreign mission hospitals and dispensaries. The supplies bought in this city are casualty kits containing surgical supplies, medicines and first aid articles originally earmarked for use by civilian defense agencies. Sale and shipment of the articles was arranged through the office of Public Safety Commissioner Thomas J. McKeown, who has served as property officer for all Civilian Defense. According to Father Randall, the value of the medical kits is "incalculable because they are all but unobtainable in foreign countries where inflationary prices make it prohibitive for poorly financed missions to make purchases of this type." The supplies have already been shipped to the New York headquarters of the Catholic Medical Mission Board for distribution overseas.

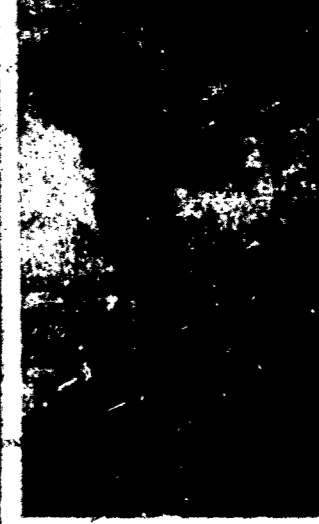

Ernest Rev. John J. Killeen, late pastor of St. Michael's Church, Penn Yan, was eulogized as a "true shepherd of souls who knew his sheep and labored with untiring spirit, to make the good better and reclaim those who had wandered," by the Rev. John H. Duffy at solemn funeral services Thursday, Aug. 5, 1948 in St. Ann's Church, Hornell.

Father Killeen, who has been in poor health for nine years, died Monday, July 23, 1948 at his home, 43 Center St., in Hornell. Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated by the Very Rev. William McPadden, V. F., assisted by the Rev. F. William Stauder as deacon, and the Rev. Hubert Bliczy, subdeacon. Officers of the Mass were: Very Rev. Edward H. Lyons, master of ceremonies; Rev. John S. Maloney, assistant master of ceremonies; Rev. Joseph F. Hogan and Rev. Thomas C. Kane, acolytes; Rev. Paul J. Gibbons, thurifer. Music was sung by the priest's choir, Rev. Benedict A. Ehrmann directing. Rt. Rev. Messrs. William F. Bergan, chancellor of the Rochester Diocese, conducted services at the grave in St. Ann's Cemetery, assisted by many diocesan priests. In his eulogy, Father Duffy, pastor of St. Augustine's, Rochester, summarized the ministry of Father Killeen in the words of St. Luke: "He went about doing good." Said Father Duffy, "He threw himself into parish work with a devotion and zeal that knew no bounds. He was
