Ex-Army Chaplain Heads For Africa as Missionary

Home only a few months from Europe and Alaska where he served as an American Army chaplain, the Rev. Charles Erb, S.V.D., will soon be heading overseas again. This time to do missionary work on the African Gold Coast.

A former Stochesterian and a graduate of Holy Family School, Father Erb expects to depart for his new assignment early next month. He is now visiting at the home of his brother, Herbert Erb, 2438 C. St., in Rochester.

The former Army chaplain, a priest of the missionary Society of the Divine Word, will go to Accra, capital city of the Gold Coast, West Africa, which is a British Crown Colony.

The Accra Mission, established ten years ago by the Fathers of the Divine Word, has 10,000 Catholics and 70,000 more natives who are potential converts. Father Erb plans to make a moving picture of the Accra Mission in order to give Americans a better knowledge of Catholic mission life on the Dark Continent.

In going to Africa as a missionary, Father Erb is realizing plans which he postponed until now. As an army chaplain he served with the Armed Forces in Alaska and Germany.

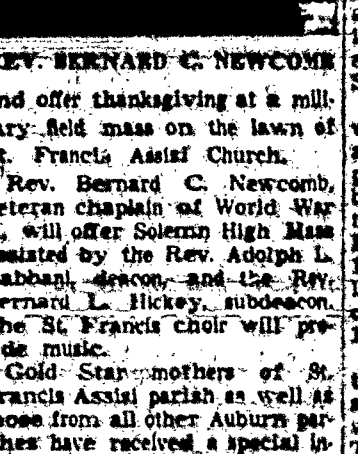

Assumption Triduum Opens Today at St. Mary's Auburn

Auburn—Rev. Dennis W. Hickey will conduct the annual triduum honoring the Feast of the Assumption, titular feast of St. Mary's parish here, beginning this evening (Thursday, Aug. 13).

Triduum devotions will open at 7:30 in the evening with services and sermon by Father Hickey, who is assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church.

Mass will be offered Friday and Saturday mornings at 6, 7 and 8 o'clock. Evening devotions consisting of prayers in honor of the Blessed Virgin, sermon and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, will begin at 7:30.

Anniversary to Be Marked Confessions will be heard on Thursday and Friday evenings for the general parish. Communion on Sunday morning when the 78th anniversary of the founding of St. Mary's parish will be observed by a Solemn High Mass at 11 o'clock closing the triduum.

Rev. Thomas Maher was the first pastor of St. Mary's Church and during his pastorate the parishioners assisted at Mass in a small wooden structure on Clark Street.

In 1888 Dr. Miles J. Loughlin was appointed the second pastor and it was during his year as pastor that the present church building was erected. Excavations were begun June 1, 1870 and the corner stone was laid in the same year.

Rev. William Mulhern was the third pastor of St. Mary's and the large parochial school was built during his pastorate. The first school house was located on Clark Street near Washington.

The corner stone of the present school was laid in the year 1880 and the school was formally opened on January 7, 1881. Rev. William Payne succeeded Father Mulhern in 1893 and Rev. John J. McGrath became pastor of St. Mary's in 1905. Rev. Dr. William E. Cowen has been pastor of St. Mary's since June 25, 1932.
