49 Retreatants Set Record at Diocesan House

Largest group of men ever to make a retreat at Our Lady of the Lake Retreat House, Geneva, at one time set an attendance record there last weekend.

Two Chinese Students Delayed in Coming for Nazareth College Term

Two Chinese students will travel from their native country this fall to Nazareth College in Pittsford to study on four-year scholarships provided by the college.

According to a letter received by the Nazareth College Dean, Sister Teresa Marie, from the Rev. John T. S. Mao, procurator of the Archdiocese of Nanking, China, the girls, Miss Chang Chau and Miss Kuo Lihai, have been delayed in getting passage to the United States, but will arrive sometime during the term.

Both recipients of full scholarships which provide \$300 a year annually for tuition, the Chinese students will have no boarding worries thanks to the generosity of the college mission unit, the Mission Society of St. Sales Institute, Geneva, and Student Mission Councils of St. Nazareth Academy, Rochester.

St. Joseph's Church is part of the Catholic Ruthenian rite. Administered by the pastor, Rev. Basil Turula, under Bishop Bohachevsky of Philadelphia, the church serves some 500 Ukrainian families in the Rochester area.

Prior to 1903, the local Ruthenians (Ukrainians) were served in their rite by a priest who came from Buffalo. The first resident pastor, Eustachius Szwinski was named in that year and the church was located on Remington St.

The present church building at 305 Hudson Avenue is a former Protestant Church purchased in 1917.
