Error in AP Story on Monk
Disclosed by Parish Weekly

A misleading report, impugning the integrity of the Catholic priesthood and printed in the Elmsford Advertiser, was exposed promptly this week by The Christus, weekly parish bulletin of St. Peter and Paul's Church, Elmsford.

An Associated Press dispatch (Aug. 12) printed in the Elmsford Advertiser implied that a priest had violated the seal of confession.

The news item dealt with the finding of Mussolini's corpse in a monastery in northern Italy. It stated that the whereabouts of the dead dictator's stoin body had been reported by a priest acting on knowledge received in the confessional.

The Christus points out the fact that the New York Times carried the full, 27, dispatch which contained this added statement: "The monk said that the man, now held by the police as a confessed assassin, had authorized him to disclose the

"It certainly is to be regretted, then," The Christus article observed, "that whoever summarized the news as AP headquarters did not have com-

Open 3rd China Mission Field

St. Columban's, Neb., (NC) - The third mission field in China to be placed under the care of St. Columban's Foreign Mission Society is a 3500 square mile tract in the north of the south China province of Chekiang, with 3,000 Catholics in total population of one million, according to an announcement from St. Columban's headquarters here.

St. Columban's new territory, which will be known as Huchow from the name of its principal city, was formerly under the direction of Bishop Jean Joseph Desjardis and the French Vincentian Fathers. Bishop Desjardis petitioned the Holy See to give him a part of his vicariate of Hanchow because he is greatly handicapped by lack of priests.

At the age of 18, President de Nicola graduated from Naples University and entered the practice of law. He soon established himself as an outstanding lawyer and after a brief ex-

perience into journalism, turned to politics in 1909 when he was elected a Deputy. He was re-elected in 1913 and 1914, but in 1914 withdrew from politics. The fascists included him in their national list and secured his fourth reelection, but he refused to take his seat.

He was a member of the Cabinet four times and served as President of the Chamber of Deputies from 1920 until 1924. In the days before the fascist power, he refused the premiership on four occasions.

President de Nicola, who has no military or naval experience, was a compromise candidate for the office. The three principal parties - Christian Democrats, Socialists and Communists - agreed to support him after it was apparent that no other outstanding candidate could win the required three-fifths vote of the Constituent Assembly.

New Italian President Drafted by 3 Parties

Rome - (NC) - The new Provisional President of the Italian Republic, 54-year-old Enrico Nicola, is known as a sincere Catholic by birth, education and conviction, and is a member of the Naples Archdiocese's fraternity of the Most Holy Trinity. It is agreed he has no personal ambitions in his taking over the presidency. In fact, he succeeded reluctantly as a civic duty.

Crucifix Removal Sought in Milan

Rome - (NC) - Anti-clerical elements in Milan are agitating for removal of crucifixes from schools, according to Alfonso Cardinal Schuster, Archbishop of Milan, who issued a sharp denunciation of the agitation.

His statement charged that for some time anti-Catholic groups in the Milan area have been carrying on the dangerous activity by urging signatures to petitions for abolition of the crucifix in Italian schools.
