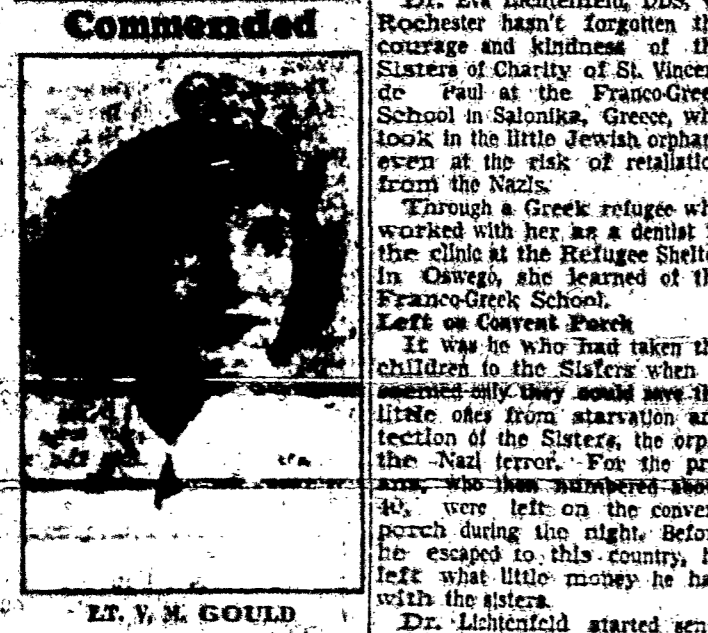

"Our Lord chose these young ladies," said Father Schwab, "to be His aides and friends in the great work of saving souls. Christ began to speak to their hearts in a hundred ways, perhaps asking them to imitate some sister, perhaps putting it into the mind of some priest to speak to them about a vocation. They heard the call and heard the voice."

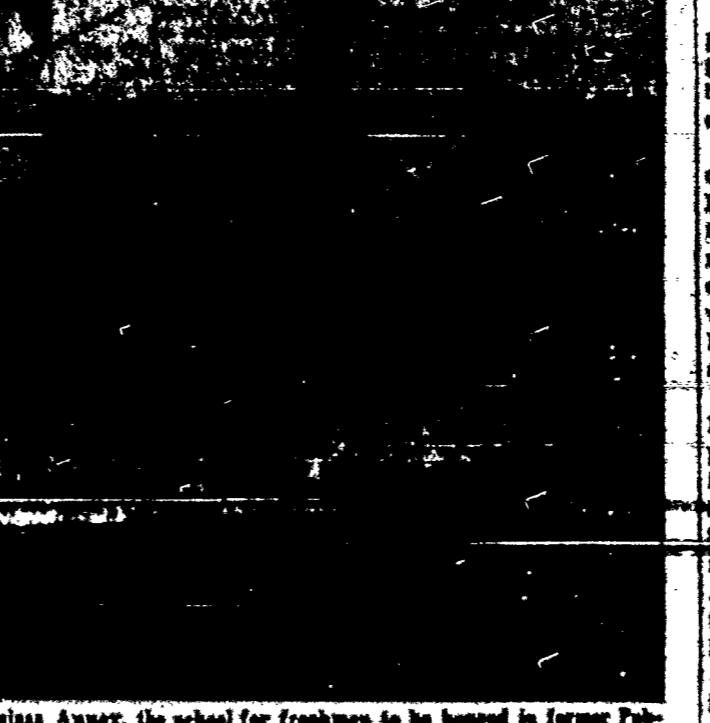
