Some Film Writers Get Red Message Across

If when all the shouting dies down it should become clear that many of the functionaries of the Screen Writers' Guild are Communists, what is to be done about it?

They represent political argument, not realistic reporting. In his original story, "Tender Comrade," I pointed out how Dalton Trumbo presented a direct argument in favor of so-called "planned parenthood" by putting into the mouth of a young soldier "Robert Ryan" firm vows not to become a father unless and until the material blessings he himself demanded for the child.

Whether they do or not it is inevitable that being Communists, either by membership or position, they are writing, in varying ways and degrees, will sometimes bear the Communist message of anti-Christ.

Faith, Two Centuries Old, Found On Jap Isle; Teacher Only Pagan

Nagasaki — There's an old Catholic Japanese island where the faith has been kept alive continuously for more than 300 years.

We came across it while traveling in the remote Goto Islands, some 50 miles out to sea from the Japanese mainland.

The morning after our arrival in Nauruhima, one of the central islands in the group, three weather-beaten Japanese fishermen called at the church, bringing in their fish from a small island; they had heard about the two Catholic priests from America who were visiting the islands.

The two were Mal. Edward J. Lambert of Dubuque, Catholic chaplain attached to GHQ, Tokyo, and myself.

Our three visitors wanted to welcome us in the name of their own island of Nauruhima. They were Catholics, they told us, and so were all the other people of the island. The school teacher, an outsider, is the only pagan in their midst.

That afternoon we visited their island, using the motorboat that the Mayor of Nauruhima placed at our service. A few minutes after we jumped to the story beach, the village strains were sounded and all Nauruhima hurried to the little church to greet us.

They are 35 families in this island, they told us, making a total of 220 persons, all Catholics.

The colony is 220 years old. Back in the 18th century, when persecution was raging in Japan proper, three brothers named Saverio, who were Catholics, fled by boat with their families to the Goto. Discovering the lonely little island, they decided to settle on it and the Catholics of Nauruhima today are their descendants.

They live by fishing and farming. Red snapper and lobster are their chief catches. They cultivate the sweet potato hillside, raising sweet potatoes their staple crop.

We promised to spend just about an hour for Mass. They were delighted and insisted on sending their best boat for us.

It was a sunny morning and the islanders had given up hope when at length our sturdy boat appeared through the curtain of rain-laden clouds. Crossed over the island, we were greeted by the priest and the school teacher.

We both addressed them, congratulating them on the treasure they possess in the Faith.
