Wm. Henry Chamberlin Listed in Culture Series

Radioed from Vatican City last week was the announcement that Pope Pius XII had granted a long private audience to the American commentator and writer, William Henry Chamberlin who is listed among the speakers in the sixth season of the Aquinas Christian Culture series which opens Friday, October 4 at Aquinas Institute.

Chamberlin, now free-lancing and observing Europe, speaks January 19 on "The Russian Enigma." He has lived in Soviet Russia for 12 years, as foreign correspondent and has seen the whole Soviet plan unfold at close range. He returns to America January 3.

Ten events are listed in the new series which opens with Mrs. Fulton J. Sheen on Friday evening, Oct. 4 on "The Signs of Our Times." This marks Mrs. Sheen's sixth appearance on the Aquinas series.

Professor Mortimer J. Adler comes directly from his educator's work at the University of Chicago for the Sunday, October 20th event. His address here is titled "The 100 Great Ideas."

Noted Commentator Coming For many years editor of McCall's and Red Book, presently woman's editor of "The Sign," national Catholic Magazine, Katherine Burton speaks November 17 on "Old Errors with New England Labels." A convert via high Anglicanism, Mrs. Burton is an acknowledged authority on the beginnings of

American History. She has been the official biographer of many prominent converts to the Catholic faith.

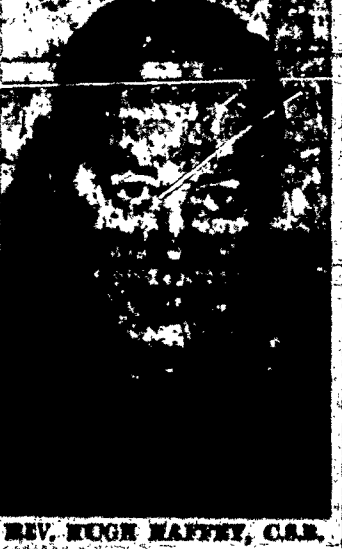
Professor Frank Guy Armitage, authority on the Great Charles Dickens, presents on December 1, "An Evening with Dickens." Dr. Armitage includes in his lecture impersonations of the great figures in Dickens' works.

The James M. Gillis, C.S.P., editor of the Catholic World, and many years a principal speaker on the Catholic Hour, appears February 7 in "How to Think About Foreign Relations."

Established as a popular interpreter of St. Augustine, 5th Century and first Christian philosopher, Prof. Vernon J. Bourke presents "Augustine's Quest for Wisdom," on February 14.

Dr. Gordon S. Seagrave, famed Burns surgeon speaks Nov. 3 on "Humanity Served Through Medicine."

Fordham and Georgetown, speaks March 2 on "The European Mentality." To save his family from Nazi attacks he took the pen name of Frances Stuart Campbell under which he wrote for America, The Sign, Atlantic, Harper's, and The Catholic World.

Loyola Unit Names Staff; Hears Philippine Appeal

It will cost about \$2,000,000 to restore completely ruined education facilities in the Philippines which were destroyed by the war, the Rev. Joseph C. Faulkner, S.J., told members of Loyola Council of Students, at an organization meeting Tuesday evening in Columbus Circle Center.

"Many Catholic school buildings in the islands were leveled by bombing, and classes are being held now in Quonset huts," said Father Faulkner. "But we cannot simply grant our mission activities because of war damage. No matter how great the need, we must continue to supply funds for the great reorganizing job that has to be done."
