Rochester Youth Wins High Honor At Georgetown U.

Richard M. Kernan of Rochester, N. Y., has been elected by the student body of Georgetown University to the office of President of the Y. M. C. A. — the greatest honor that a student of Georgetown can receive.

Kernan is the son of Mrs. John L. Kernan, 240 East Avenue, Rochester. He was graduated from Aquinas Institute in September, 1941, and at that time was Senior Basketball Manager. In September, 1942, he entered Georgetown University and soon became Freshman Football Manager, a staff member of the college weekly, The Post, and a member of the Quater Debating Society. He left Georgetown to join the Army Air Corps.

Kernan served 3 years with the Army Air Forces, 1 1/2 of which were overseas. As a first lieutenant, he participated in 14 B-29 missions over the Japanese homeland and was awarded the Air Medal with one Oak Leaf Cluster. His unit, the 44th Bomb Group, was twice awarded the Distinguished Unit Citation. Returning to Georgetown in April, 1945, Kernan once again was named General Chairman of the Home Resignation Ball held here in Washington, last May and was a member of the Reception Committee for the National Alumni held in June. He continued as Football Manager and for his work with the Athletic Association was awarded the major varsity "G". As President of the Y. M. C. A. of Georgetown University, Kernan represents the entire student body which by the fall will number over 1500. As a result of his election to Y. M. C. A. Presidency, he is also Chairman of the Student Council, President of the Athletic Association, and Student Representative on the Faculty Board. Kernan is a Junior of the College of Arts and Sciences and is majoring in Economics. He will be graduated from Georgetown in June, 1947.

Vigorous opposition to the projected federal school aid bill was voiced here at a meeting of the Knights of St. John who passed a resolution to write U. S. senators asking them to vote the measure down.

The bill which was the main topic of discussion at a two-day conference in the houses here this week was also condemned as "contrary to the G. I. Bill of Rights and the highly respected school laws passed." It is incumbent upon the spirit of the constitutional provision that protect the right of every citizen to worship God according to his own conscience.
