

Lecture Series on Church Apostolic to Open Tuesday

Rev. Benedict Khmann will open a weekly lecture series on the general subject "The Church Apostolic" Tuesday evening, Oct. 1 at 8:30 p. m. at St. Joseph's House of Holy Names.
