

Mt. Carmel Veterans Organize CWV Post

Third Catholic War Veterans Post organized in the city of Rochester was founded in Our Lady of Mount Carmel Hall, Ontario St., Monday, Sept. 30 when 110 veterans of World War II voted to make immediate charter application to national C.W.V. headquarters.

Rev. Edward A. Shamon, assistant pastor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish, was named chaplain of the new post. The organizers also elected as temporary officers: Acting Commander, Mory Marzullo; Acting Adjutant, Sam Scoglio, and Acting Treasurer, James Caputo. Chairman of the publicity committee is Arthur Muelo.

William Cummings of Buffalo, national organizer of the C.W.V., and Frederick Grotz, C.W.V., Erie County, Commander, explained the aims and purposes of the organization. A membership drive was immediately launched in an attempt to incorporate most of the veterans living in the Mt. Carmel area who served in the Armed Forces.

Those veterans who join within 30 days will be classified as charter members. It was announced. Women who served in the armed forces as well as Veterans of both World Wars will be eligible to join.
