Solemn Pontifical Mass in St. Joseph's Church to be celebrated at 9 a. m. by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, will attract knights, their families and members of other Catholic lay groups. The Mass will be in Thanksgiving for the 50 golden years of Columbianism according to Grand Knight Francis T. Toomey.

Fr. Gillis to Preach
 Jubilee sermon will be preached by the Rev. James M. Gillis, C.S.P., editor of the Catholic World, New York who is arriving Friday afternoon. Father Gillis, columnist for the Rochester Courier-Journal and other Catholic newspapers throughout the country spoke in Rochester ten years ago for a Catholic Women's Club audience.

Friends who are members of the Knights of Columbus will assist the Bishop in the Mass. The Rev. Arthur E. Rattigan, council chaplain states.

More than 500 are expected at the Jubilee dinner in Powers Hotel Saturday night at which Richard Reid, editor, The Catholic News, archdiocesan newspaper of New York, will be speaker.

Bishop Kearney will be guest of honor and as past state chaplain, extend greetings to the state and national officers.

Toastmaster Norman A. O'Brien, General Chairman, Ralph F. Murphy, Lecturer Raymond L. Nary in charge of music will be on the program. Vice Chairman Rocco F. Natale has charge of the Columbus Day portion of the program.
