### 4 Projects Approved By Nurses' Sodality

Decision on four major projects was made at the Sodality of Our Lady of St. Joseph's Hospital, School of Nurses, meeting in Elmira Friday evening, Oct. 3, in the Dunn Memorial living rooms.

The Sodality voted to say the Rosary among the students in groups every evening during the month of October. The group suggested and passed for approval the intention of adoring the Blessed Sacrament in relays as public exposition would take place on every First Friday during the time of morning Mass until after duty in the evening.

Active participation of every Sodality in the plan to keep reading matter in circulation among the patients in the hospital was promised. Because of demands on the treasury and need for additional funds, a dance for the students and their friends during the latter part of October was voted upon favorably.

Prior to the meeting, the students assisted at the devotions in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in Little Flower Chapel of the Dunn Memorial. In the morning of the same day, they had joined in the Biologic Mass.

Following the biologic meeting, movies were shown by Miss Catherine McCarthy, from the parish of St. Peter and Paul. All of the films were taken by Miss McCarthy. Among the interesting shorts shown were, Pontifical procession and Mass on the occasion of the consecration of Mother Cabrini, held July 19, 1935, Peter and Paul Church, the laying of the cornerstone for the parish Church of Our Lady of Lourdes in Elmira, Father Stemmer's Golden Jubilee celebration. Secular films of the circus and scenes in Madison Square garden, of the Sorja Henle ice show, were included. Refreshments were served following the meeting.

### Future Hopeful With Bishops in Message For Mission Sunday

A "radiant future" is in prospect for missionaries in the far-flung outposts of Catholicism, the Rev. John S. Randa, diocesan director, Society for the Propagation of the Faith, states in calling diocesan attention to the approach of Mission Sunday (October 20).

Father Randa states: Sunday, October 20, is Mission Sunday throughout the Catholic World. This is the day in the year set aside by His Holiness, for us to contribute to the cause of the Missions. Last February, Monsignor McDonnell, the National Director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith had an audience with the Holy Father. At that time, Pope Pius XII thanked America for its generous support of the missions, and then said: "So much today depends upon generous America."

Everywhere the missionaries are busy clearing away material ruins and repairing moral ones. And everywhere their spirit is equal to the occasion. They have fixed their gaze not on the narrow past but on the radiant future that lies before them.

Our Mission in China writes: We continue to work hard and are kept busy at the present task of forming good Christians and organizing Christian communities, trusting ever in the help of the Lord, which cannot fail us, and to the subsidies and also we look forward to receiving soon.

From Mexico City I write: Our Father-son was pillaged and was put in the stocks and was exposed to the stinging sun from high noon till five o'clock in the scorching sun. He spent three days on the road. He was forced to do street-cleaning and act as a water-carrier. He was beaten and threatened with death to deny the Faith. But he remained firm and was even beyond insult with joy at the prospect of approaching martyrdom. This missionary suffered more than any other of us and yet he is in the highest of spirits. In God's hand the Faith
