**Sodalists of Our Lady**  
**Shut-in Sodalists**

Sometimes ago I had heard of this special group of Sodalists and was very anxious to learn more about them. It was not until last week in an excellent article in the September St. Anthony Messenger that I found a full description of these unusual and unique companions of Mary. They are all members of the National Sodality of Our Lady, but they are so physically handicapped that they can take no active part in Sodality affairs. So they sanctify their time with spiritual activities, setting aside several days each month for special union devotions.

They are not hypochondriacs or invalid sufferers. They are bedridden, permanently sick and long-disabled with very little hope of becoming well. They see and know one another only through and through and through their own Sodality paper called *Secunde Sanctificati*. Their life is one of intense physical pain but also of sublime dramatization of submission to the Will of God. They accept their fate not in any cynical sense but in joyful faith and trust in God's Divine Mercy and Wisdom.

Their chosen resignation to God's Holy Will instead of the withering despair that engulfs so many sufferers. They radiate from their beds of pain a cheerful and saintly patience that is a model of Christian living. They live no life of monastic seclusion. Current affairs and present-day social problems occupy their attention as well as all things religious.

**6 Women Walk 550 Miles On Lourdes Pilgrimage**

Paris — (NC) — Six women took part in the pilgrimage to Lourdes by former German prisoners and deportees made the entire journey of about 550 miles from Paris to Lourdes on foot. One of the women was 53 years old.

When the six pilgrims arrived at Montauban, Bishop Peter Theas of that city invited them to breakfast and served them himself. Bishop Theas had also been deported by the Germans.

Other prisoner pilgrims who traveled to Lourdes as fast as walked more than 500 miles from Gijón.

Some 150 pilgrims from the entire region of Lorraine a pilgrimage on foot in Paris a distance of about 150 miles to the Basilica of the Sacred Heart, Montmartre, to offer thanks for the liberation of their town and France. They had made a vow to undertake the pilgrimage the day after France fell in 1940.

At one point of their journey they were met by Robert Prigent, Minister of Population and Former Secretary of the Catholic League.
