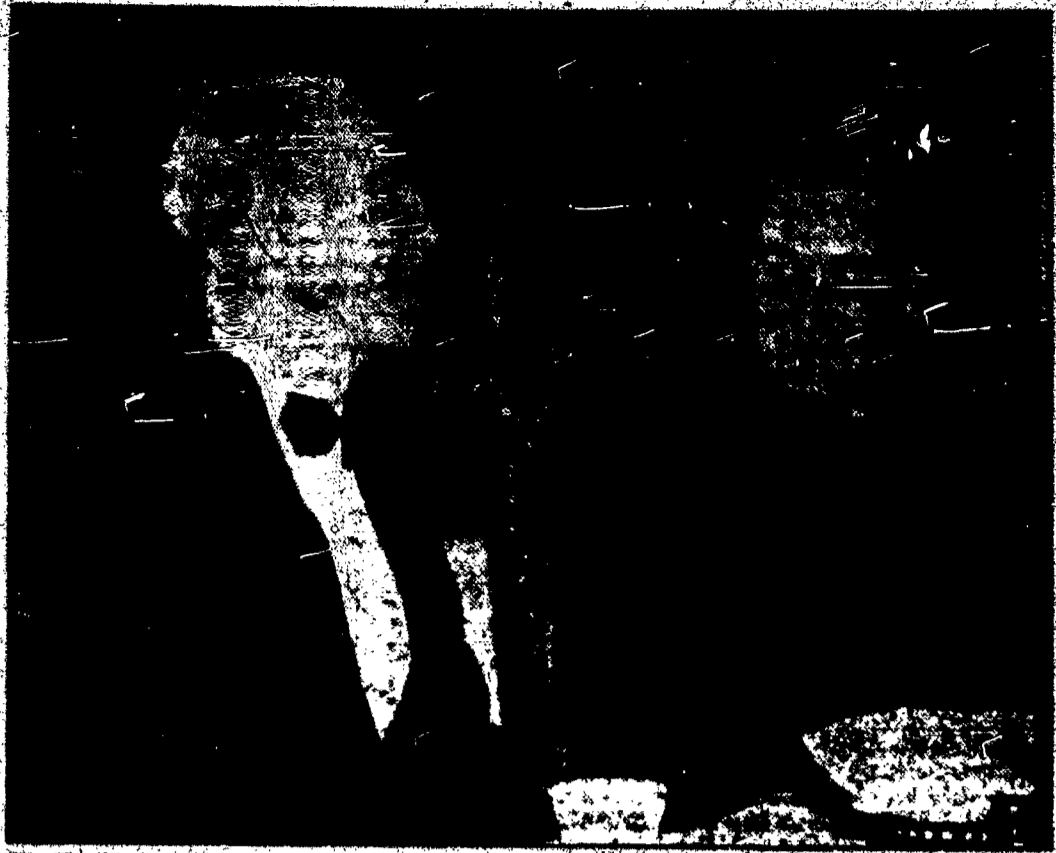


### Bring K. C. Jubilee Felicitations
