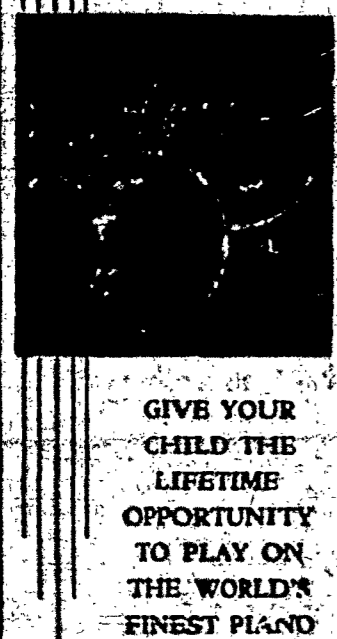

### Loyalty to Our King

During the past war millions of men and women answered the call of their various countries. They marched forth to danger, hardship and death with courage in their hearts and song upon their lips. They slept in the water-soaked fox-holes of whither Europe and watched beneath the blazing sun pouring down upon their jungle hideouts. They smiled at their wounds and drove their planes and tanks with fearless bravery through bomb and shellfire. They fell by the thousands and their bodies were buried in the long furrows of the war beneath the waving mounds of matted and unmarked graves. Whatever the righteousness or the injustice of their cause, no one doubts the courage and the fortitude displayed on both sides of the war. The valor shown at the front was matched by the sacrifices at home. Wives and mothers sent forth their sons and daughters and with anxious, eager hearts awaited the uncertain news from the distant battlefronts. Rich and poor alike gave of their money and the total sums reached staggering proportions. Even then governments endorsed greater war budgets that were met eagerly by the people. No sacrifice no effort was too great to bear. And Catholics were not to be surpassed in devotion to their country. Nowhere was patriotism inscribed more deeply and

imprinted more indelibly than in the hearts of the children of God's own Church. An Obvious Question Yet as we consider the scenes of heroism and self-sacrifice of the recent war, the question obviously comes to us: "How does our loyalty to Christ and to His cause, the promotion of His Kingdom on earth, compare with this lavish display of patriotic spirit? Have we shown the same eagerness to take an active part in the great spiritual struggle which Christ came to wage for the conquest of the world?" We don't, of course, mean to belittle the spirit of patriotic Patriotism is a noble thing, in which Christ Himself subscribed. When founded upon religion it becomes sublime. That's why I speak of it as a model for the loyalty we must show in the service of Christ our King and the zeal we are to show in His Crusade against the evil powers of this world. We are the avowed soldiers of Christ. Received into His great army through Baptism, we have been strengthened by our Confirmation to fight bravely and fearlessly. We are constantly fortified and sustained by His most precious Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist. What then have we done to glorify ourselves in the sight of Christ our Kingly Leader? When we shall hear the trumpet tones of the last reveille and see His battle standard of the Cross dash in the sky, shall we be found worthy of the Cross of Honor and the Sign of Merit in His service?

### Czech Bishops Plead For Religious Study

Prague (NC) - Members of the Czech Episcopate have been received by Jaroslav Stransky, Minister of Schools in the Prague government, and have submitted to him a plan for the retention of religious instruction in Czech schools, retention of schools operated by religious Orders, and increased pay for lay teachers of religion. Mr. Stransky, who is a practicing Catholic, assured the delegation that he would do all in his power to comply with the wishes of the Episcopate. One of the requests has found a satisfactory solution with the announcement that the pay of lay teachers of religion has been raised to 90 crowns an hour (about 40 cents under the present rate of exchange). They will also receive compensation for traveling expenses. The delegation was led by Bishop Matrice Picha of Hradec Kralove and Bishop Karel Skoupy of Brno. The other Czech dioceses, which are still vacant, were represented by the Vicars General.

Mass for German Youth Falls, Germany (NC) - A crowd of 5,000 young men and women of the Diocese of Fulda gathered in the Cathedral here to attend a Pontifical Mass celebrated by Bishop Aloisius J. Muench of Fargo, N.D., Apostolic Visitor to Germany.
