

NO CHURCH CLASH WITH DEMOCRACY CARDINAL SAYS

Headquarters — (Cable, NC)—His Eminence Joseph Cardinal Mindszenty, Archbishop of Esztergom, emphatically denied that there is any incompatibility between the Church and democracy in an interview while visiting Pecs, one of this country's largest cultural centers.

Every human being has certain inalienable rights which must be respected. The teachings of the Church never did and never will conflict with true democracy.

The Cardinal also declared that there must be greater freedom for people who wish to enter political life. Public office must be open to all men who have the required knowledge and a feeling of responsibility to the people, he stated.

North Ireland Measure Scored
Dublin — (NC) — Bitter criticism of the penalization of so-called voluntary schools in Northern Ireland was expressed during a debate on the Education Bill in Stormont, the parliament of the Six Counties. Under the bill, the building grant for new voluntary schools is to be raised from 50 to 65 per cent of the cost, but schools catering for Protestant and other non-Catholic denominations are allowed 100 per cent — where controlled by public authorities.

good of evil," the Holy Father asked.

"If men believing in God do not glorify Him as God and give thanks: if their faith is kept in a hidden closet of their private chamber, while immorality, malice, covetousness and all manner of wickedness are given full use of the drawing room and public resorts, it is surprising that God should give them up in the lustful desires of their heart to uncleanliness, to that women have exchanged the natural use for that which is against nature, men have become full of envy and murder, contention, hatred to God, irreverent, proud, haughty, disobedient to parents without affection, without fidelity, without mercy."

Concluding His Holiness said that instruction in the faith is necessary, and indispensable, "not only for children in Sunday schools and growing youth in higher classes," but also that it "should hold a place of honor in college and university curricula." He pointed out that millions never enter college, "not from their number will come leaders in important spheres of your national life," and he asked: "Are they to approach their tasks with the most meagre, shallow knowledge of their God, of the Father, Redeemer, and their Mother the Church?"

High Mass In Iroquois

Montreal — (MNS) — For the first time in this city's history a Pontifical High Mass was sung in the Iroquois tongue as Canadian Jesuits celebrated the anniversary of the martyrdom of St. Isaac Jogues. The Mass was celebrated by the Most Rev. Joseph Charbonneau, Archbishop of Montreal, at the Church of the Immaculate Conception, which is staffed by Jesuit priests.

LATVIAN CHURCH HIT, SAYS BISHOP

London — (NC) — The only difference between the Germans and the Russians is in their methods of applying suffering, Bishop Joseph Rancans, Auxiliary in Riga, told press representatives here, including something of the miseries of forgotten Latvia under Russian occupation.

The Bishop who has only recently arrived in this country from his native Latvia, stated that all religious institutions in Latvia have been abolished. There are no more Catholic publications. No seminaries are allowed and no Bishop or priest may communicate with the Holy See.

Put Economic House In Order, Jesuit Urges

New York — (NC) — "If the United States is to shape the future according to democratic pattern, if the Four Freedoms are to prevail, we must put our economic house in order and do it fast," the Rev. Benjamin J. Masse, S.J., associate editor of America, national Catholic weekly, cautioned Sunday in an address on the Catholic Hour radio program.

Vatican Hails U.S. Repayment to Italy

Instructions:
