Parish activities have increased and flourished under Father Rawlinson's direction. In May 1943, the St. Elizabeth Society for women was organized and is today an outstanding group in the Catholic life of Corning. The St. Patrick's Cadets, well known not only in this city but throughout the Southern Tier for their morale and marching ability, are also a product of his enthusiasm.

Father Rawlinson's interest in civic affairs is abundant. He has served for many years on the Board of Directors of the Community Social Service Society.

Born in Liverpool, England, Father Rawlinson came to this country at the age of 8 with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Charles John Rawlinson. The family settled in Elmira where he attended Immaculate Conception School. He entered St. Andrew's Seminary and completed the studies for the priesthood at St. Bonaventure Seminary. He was ordained in June 1926 by Bishop Burns and J. McQuaid.

Following service as assistant pastor in Ithaca, Geneva, Mt. Morris and St. Mary's in Rochester, Father Rawlinson was made vice-chancellor of the Diocese of the children's welfare work in Rochester. He was appointed pastor of St. Patrick's Church on October 22, 1942.
