Chaplain's Peace Role Stressed by Bp. Arnold

The fighting role of the chaplain is equally as important in a troubled world today as it was during the war years, Bishop William R. Arnold, former chief of chaplains of the U. S. Army declared here this week. Bishop Arnold, who retired last year after 33 years as an Army chaplain, came to Rochester last Monday as guest speaker at the formal presentation of the Catholic War Veterans Chapter to Holy Rosary Post, Rochester's first C. W. V. post. "Our chaplains today," said the former St. Bernard's man, "and the men who served as chaplains during the war years still have an important role to play in being spiritual leaders of the men served in the armed forces. They must and can do for them what they did for them while in service." The Bishop warned that the problems of war "are not solved" by the peace which follows. "The peace will require the same courage, loyalty and self sacrifice it took to win the war, he predicted. He termed the recent war "a spiritual conflict" one to be

He holds a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Rochester, a Master of Arts from Columbia University and a certificate in social work from the Catholic University of America and the New York School of Social Work. His wife, Margaret, and in his first daughter reside in Rome.

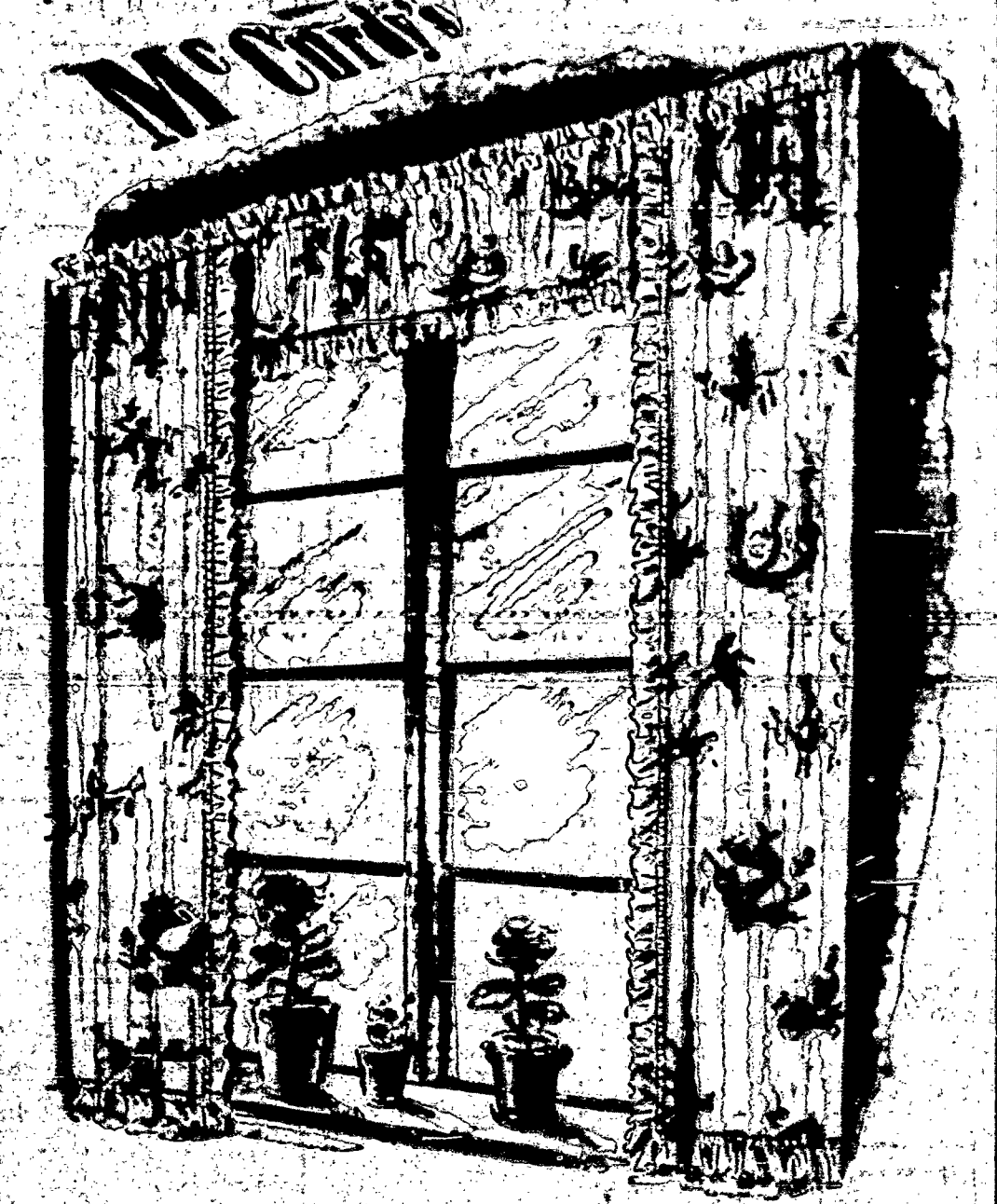
700 Nun-Founders Beatified at Vatican

Rome — (AP)—The ceremonies of beatification for 700 nuns, founder of the Society of Mary Help of Christians began here Sunday. Her community labors in Fatima in the southern most part of South America, where their principal work is the care of children. At another beatification ceremony on Tuesday the Venerable Eusebio Teresa Verzer, who founded the Daughters of the Sacred Heart at Antwerp in 1873 was raised to the ranks of Blessed. On November 24, the venerable martyrs who lost their lives in the Boxer Rebellion in China in 1900 will be beatified. The beatification of Venerable Maria Goretti, martyr, is scheduled for December.

PRIESTS, YOUTHS HELD IN RED ZONE

Dresden, Germany — (AP)—The Rev. Leonard Schneider, who is in charge of Catholic educational activities in Berlin, was arrested in his apartment and has since disappeared. A request for information on his whereabouts addressed to the Soviets has remained unanswered. In Dresden, Easton, five members of the Catholic Democratic Union were arrested while on their way to the station after a meeting in the apartment of Father Lubczyk. Among the arrested was Father Henry, of Easton, Saxony, who had been in jail under the Nazis for two years and three widely known in the Catholic youth movement. It seems their meeting with Father Lubczyk was considered illegal because only the communist youth organization is officially admitted in the Soviet zone.
