Text of Diocesan NCCW Resolutions

Here is the complete text of the resolutions adopted today at the annual convention of the Rochester Diocesan Council, National Council of Catholic Women:

I - Catholic Societies Bearing in mind the need and importance of Catholic Societies and realizing the splendid work they have done in the past, we urge our Catholic women to affiliate with Catholic organizations, parochial or inter-parochial, and to participate actively in the work of the Catholic lay apostolate.

II - Retreats Realizing that retreats and days of recollection are most important factors in developing personal sanctification, so essential to real Catholic Action, we pledge ourselves to cooperate to a wider extension of this movement.

III - International Relations We call on Catholic women more generally to become familiar with the basic principles of peace as laid down by Our Holy Father, Pope Pius XII, and with the problems of peace and the organizations designed to meet these problems. We urge them, furthermore, to make their voices heard and use their power as citizens, members and leaders of civic organizations and public bodies, to have the principles of justice and charity operate in international organization and in all international action.

A. International Cooperation We urge immediate steps to be taken by the United Nations Security Council, since in practice its obstructive effect on international cooperation has been demonstrated.

B. Human Rights We urge that the Human Rights Commission of the United Nations in its formulation of an international bill of rights also recommend adequate methods of enforcing those rights, either through a special Court or Courts, or some other method.

C. Small Nations We call upon our government to give testimony to the right and to champion the weak and the enslaved in the writing of the peace treaties.

END PERSECUTION TITO IS URGED (Continued from Page 1) shouted, because they had learned during the horrible months of communist rule that refusal to obey the orders would cost them their jobs and ration card number eight, which entitles to the purchase of food, clothes and shoes furnished by UNRRA, the reports from Yugoslavia declare, "In that period, six priests were stoned or clubbed to death by terrorist bands, and several others had to flee for their lives after threatening demonstrations." Agents of the OZNA (Tito's secret police) stood at the church doors writing down the names of those entering. "For the single reason that they had attended Mass, fathers of families were dismissed from employment, and widows and war orphans were deprived of the state subsidy which was their only means of sustenance."

and before the bar of the United Nations under any circumstances where justice is in doubt. D. Peace Treaties Vengeful peace treaties will lead to another war. We commend our government in its present effort to make a peaceful peace treaty for Italy, Finland, Bulgaria, Roumania and Hungary, and we urge that it work for terms in the same spirit with Germany, Austria and Japan in future peace treaties. We urge that all the treaties be written in terms of one world and of the purposes of the United Nations, that is, in terms of the future and not in terms of the past.

E. Freedom of Religion We ask that complete freedom of religion, as well as freedom of religious worship, be among the Human Rights guaranteed for all peoples in the Peace Treaties.

F. Archbishop Stepinac The Rochester Diocesan Council of Catholic Women voices its indignation at the arrest and imprisonment of the saintly Archbishop Aloysius Stepinac of Zagreb, Croatia, by the Tito government as a criminal because he declined to cooperate with the atheistic Communist forces now in control of Yugoslavia.

IV - Social Action A. Home and Family Life We know actual family life to be a basic factor in the civilization of our nation. No steps toward remedying our present dreadful family situation can be successful until religion is again given its honored place in the American home. Contributing to the secondary place the home and the family now occupy in the nation is the widespread employment of women in industry. This situation, which makes possible full and genuine family life, Christian family life is more important than full production in industry.

B. Divorce The American Divorce rate exceeds that of any civilized nation in the world. Homes constitute the foundation of the nation. When a foundation is undermined no structure can stand. It is a truism of history that disintegration of the home leads to collapse of national vitality. We urge, therefore, not only our government but also for reasons of patriotism that effective steps be taken to curb the cancer of divorce.

C. Housing Conscious of the important role that good housing in a decent neighborhood has in the development of normal family life, and aware of the great housing shortage there is today, we recommend the adoption of a long-range housing program which will encourage the building of rental housing and of homes at prices the average American can afford to pay, provide the government assistance to housing projects for low-income families, and encourage slum clearance and urban redevelopment so that family life may have an opportunity to survive. This program should be extended to rural areas, provided the homes are built on economically productive land. There should be emphasis on providing housing for migrant workers.

D. Social Diseases Social disease is basically a moral problem. Therefore, we recommend more intense, widespread moral training of our youth. We recommend community efforts to raise the standards of community life and to eradicate the causes of social diseases.

E. Education - Decent Literature We call upon Catholic women today to arouse public indignation against the sale of indecent literature and to assist, through every means within their power, in building a fine American literature and in developing an appreciation of good reading in themselves, their families, their parishes, and communities.

V - Economic Action Equal Rights Amendment The drive to submit to the States for national adoption the so-called Equal Rights Amendment has been completely successful. The campaign will continue their campaign. We pledge our energies to its permanent defeat. Unjust legal discrimination against women should however be removed from the federal and state books. A federal law should also be passed to supplement the wage-hours law equal with men for equal kinds of work. The Equal Rights Amendment would nullify now-existing laws for the protection for women in work and in family life.
