Elmira Charities Consolidated With Diocesan Corporation

Mergers of Elmira Catholic Charities with the Rochester Catholic Charities announced at the annual dinner in Mark Twain Hotel, Monday night in conformity with the pattern throughout New York State, His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, guest of honor, said at the dinner.

The State Welfare Department, the Bishop said, has set up one corporation for Catholic Charities work in each diocese throughout the state. The Elmira office will now be enabled to undertake Child Placing in the county of Chemung.

While the charities corporations are known by the name of the See city, His Excellency pointed out it does not signify that the work of the charity organization is confined to that city or is it particular to it but is diocesan wide in scope.

Bishop Kearney said that while he has the title of Bishop of Rochester, he is just as much the Bishop of Elmira and of Geneva, or Canandaigua or any other community within the diocese territory. He declared that the new arrangement will not change the present Elmira Charities set-up and that the Elmira Board of Directors would function much as in the past.

Mass in Memory of 17 War Heroes Listed in Elmira

A Solemn Military Mass commemorating the sacrifice of 17 men of St. Anthony's Parish, Elmira, will be celebrated Sunday, Nov. 10, under the auspices of the Veterans of St. Anthony's parish organization.

Rev. Ignatius St. George, chaplain of the V.E.A., will celebrate the memorial Mass which will also be offered in thanksgiving on behalf of the St. Anthony's men who returned safely.

Assisting will be the Rev. John S. Maloney as deacon and the Rev. Albert L. Simonetti, sub-deacon.

Father Maloney, former paratroop chaplain and holder of the Distinguished Service Cross and other military decorations, will preach the sermon.

Beginning at 8:30 a. m. the Solemn Procession of veterans and clergy will proceed from the rectory up North Main Street to Washington and to the church.

Officers of the V.E.A. are: Commander Frank Leach, Executive Officer Philip A. Brown, Paymaster John Casotto, Adjutant Leonard Cori and Master-at-Arms Leo Ciccoli.

This Mass is for those who died in World War I and World War II. A special block of seats will be reserved for guests at the Mass.

Bishop Scores Ruler of Northern Ireland

Dublin — (NCI) — Charges brought against the Catholic Church by the Premier of Northern Ireland were repudiated sharply by Bishop of Derry on the occasion of the annual convention of the Derry Catholic Clubs.

Referring to a speech by Premier Sir Basil Brooke in which he had charged that one of the main obstacles to a united Ireland was the fact that the Catholic Church in Ireland was to a great extent anti-British, and anti-Unionist, the Bishop declared: "At the present time it is popular to attack the Catholic Church. You have seen it in Hitler and in Stalin. It speaks badly for the ruler of any country when he has to condemn the religious body which is, numerically, the strongest religious body in the area over which he governs."
