WORK OF ALJO CLUB RECALLED AT 1st REUNION

First annual reunion of the Aljo Club, organized 24 years ago in Holy Redeemer parish, brought together one hundred business men, members of the original club, Sunday afternoon in Holy Ghost parish hall.

Rev. Albert Geiger, pastor of Holy Ghost, who guided the group in Holy Redeemer from 1922 to 1936, was host to the men at a buffet supper.

High Mass was offered Sunday morning by Father Geiger for living and deceased members of the Aljo Club. Plans for celebration of the club's silver jubilee in 1946 were made and officers were elected at a meeting in the afternoon. All boys welcome.

During the years, thousands of young people in the city were entertained at the public tables in the club rooms. Hundreds of young men, irrespective of creed, color or nationality, were trained in competitive athletic sports, the members recalled.

The Aljo Club pioneered in the "dry night club" idea and with the cooperation of the owners transformed a dumping ground into Aljo Premier Park used for years by the young people of the city's Northeast section.

In 1922, the Aljo Basketball team won the city championship. A summer camp for underprivileged boys was conducted for several successive years at Crows Lake and residences of those days furnished many a hearty laugh Sunday afternoon.

Father Geiger kept in touch with scores of Aljo boys during years of government service by a monthly circular letter which served to interest the boys in getting together to compare experiences.
