### 275 Men Hear Msgr. Boland Urge Prompt Curb on Communism

Asbury — "Communism is spreading because its false teachings hypnotize," the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John P. Boland told 275 men at the annual Communion Breakfast of St. Mary's Church Holy Name Society, Sunday in the Coburn Hotel.

The members headed by their president, Charles A. Cora, received Holy Communion in a body at the 7:30 a. m. Mass.

"You men of the Holy Name Society, followers and sons of Jesus Christ possess the only key that will prove a barrier for combating the seeking of world-wide power of this monster-Communism. It is up to you to act wisely right now and not to wait," Monsignor Boland, pastor and author, declared.

In the new order, "the Kingdom of God" offered by him as a cure for Communism, Monsignor Boland said "the crooked ways will have to be made straight."

**Every Day of Week**

"All should remain Christians on Monday on on Tuesday and must carry their cross of religion and justice into their daily lives and work.

"To possess the key to fair wages, fair prices and peaceful way of life. We have the key to happiness in the life of Christ and we will see that key of the Kingdom of Christ and His Gospel. We shall abide by the teachings of His Church in stamp out Communism and paganism. God grant that we see this power to the hilt."

False concepts of Communism existing in this country were ex-

posed by the distinguished churchman.

"Communism as patterned by Lenin and Stalin carries the seeds of oppression of the workers and its precepts are carried out with fogging, violence and murder," he said.

The speaker stated that Communism's principles called for forced labor without arbitration of any kind. "It brought starvation in 1933 and 1934 to the masses of peasants in the Ukraine in the Soviet Union."

"The Communist plan in Soviet industry is the paying of two men for the same job but with two separate kinds of wages. That would be heresy with the unions here but it is not heresy in Russia under the Lenin and Stalin system."

**Eyes Witness of Moscow**

"I visited in Leningrad, Kiev and Moscow and noticed the depressed and gloomy peoples who were shabbily dressed as they were forced to bow to their Communist masters. If a man carried a briefcase and they were government workers. Hardly a man can afford cigars and luxuries are taboo for both sexes."

"The freedom of worship is limited as the churches are the property of the Soviet. Religion cannot be taught to anyone under 18 years of age in the church and the government authorizes all teachings outside of the church."

"I saw Orthodox monks in Moscow, who were being starved because they would not bow to the Soviets and do the bidding of Red leaders."

"There is no collective bargaining or arbitration," Monsignor Boland stated. "If there are any objections of strikes, impu-
