CHRIST—ATOMIC LEADER

The atom, with all its blasting, burning energy, can be compared with the dynamic radiation which Christ emitted during His lifetime on earth. When He was only two years old, He evoked this energy to the learned doctors and Pharisees in the Temple. He diffused His knowledge in everyone present.

When the buyers and sellers were transacting their business in the Temple, Christ drove them out. This is a startling example of His great power, especially when you consider that ONE MAN drove them out, with a little corded whip—ONE MAN against a multitude of vicious men who were His enemies. When we are confronted with obstacles, by enemies who attack our faith, why don't we have the courage to stand up for what is right? Why don't we use the corded whip of the Truth, which has the strength of many atoms. Because we have the Truth we do not have to bow and scrape to anyone. Yes, we might pay the penalty—but then, Christ did. Why can't we? The greatest miracle that Christ ever performed was His Resurrection. Christ rose from the dead by His own power, His own strength. We Socialists must raise first ourselves and then others to the standards of real Catholic life. If ever there was anyone who reached what the preacher says is the "highest peak" in life, it was Christ. We may be able to preach but when it comes to "practicing what we preach" it is a different story. We must remember that religion is not merely something to be memorized and understood. It is first of all, something to be lived. Christ, then, is challenging us. Will we accept the challenge? Can we dare to be Christ-like? Will we?

Polish Envoy to U.S. Branded 'Quisling'

New York—(NC)—Stating that "there were many 'Quislings' some serving German and some serving Russian masters, Sidney Hook, chairman of the Philosophy Department at New York University, declares that "far and away the most distinguished individual who in the eyes of most of his compatriots qualifies for the role is Oscar Lange, the present Polish Ambassador to the United States."

Professor Hook makes this declaration in an article, entitled "Oscar Lange—Polish Quisling," appearing in a current issue of The New Leader, liberal labor weekly published here. The peculiar position of Mr. Lange, who has renounced his U.S. citizenship to become Polish Ambassador for the puppet regime in Warsaw and who technically is supposed to represent the interests of Catholic Poland in the United States, has frequently been pointed out in the Catholic Press. In his article, Professor Hook, who speaks of numerous discussions he has had with the diplomat, describes a "Quisling" as "a man who directly or indirectly cooperates with or supports a foreign government against the democratic interests of his own people."

He is a man, he writes, "who cannot plead ignorance of what he is doing and whom he is serving, who cannot extenuate his actions on the pretense of patriotism, and who unreservedly supports with all his energies the reign of terror under which the martyred people of Poland now live."

Walsh, S.J., of Fordham University, at the Boston Public Library in November and December, 1941, forms the basis for a study of Dante entitled "Dante Alighieri, Citizen of Christendom," published by the Bruce Publishing Company here.
