### House of David Court Five To Face Wainwright's Next

Auburn—The original House of David basketball team, recognized as the World's most colorful team, from Jacksonville, Florida, will make an appearance in Auburn Saturday night to tangle with the powerful Auburn Waterloos on the State Armory floor at 9 p. m.

The Wainwrights, fast becoming one of the leading teams in the East, lost a basketball opening to the great Chicago Harlem Globe Trotters Wednesday (Nov. 13) 54-48 and then came back to turn back easily a strong Montreal Que. Miras aggregation Saturday 54-39.

Manager "Doc" Harding was happy in obtaining the House of David quintet because of several House of David teams on the road, this Bearded David team is the best in the country.

Headed the list will be Bill Steinecker, basketball's greatest clown and long shot artist who has been with the Rays for 12 years, joining them immediately after his graduation from De Paul University where he was captain and hailed as one of the College's best players of all time. Steinecker will pair with Ham Hamilton nine year player at guard positions. Ham, who has played 100 games with the House of David's is the only Southerner on the club. He is a great defensive player.

London Burgess, is the leading scorer on the team and has an average 47 points per game in his five years of playing with the club. He stands 6 feet 3 inches tall and weighs 175 lbs. Burgess will start at the other forward post. Short is a former California University star. At center is the great Tom "Bugs" Kaufman, 6'7" who is being looked a match by another top prospect, the heavy weight center, Ed Kelly. Kelly is a former St. Ignace boy and will play a starting berth, the House of David manager Jim McDonnell announced.
