33 Polish Falcon War Veterans Honored at 40th Anniversary

Auburn — Fortieth anniversary of Auburn Nest, Polish Falcons of America, was observed at a two-day celebration highlighted last Sunday by the closing banquet attended by over 650 persons.

Climax of the dinner program came with the awarding of \$50 government savings bonds to the 33 Falcon veterans of World War II. The exercises were held at the organization and silver and gold medals as well as other honors.

Another feature of the anniversary observance was the celebration by Rev. Jerome Holubowicz, O.M.C., pastor of the memorial Mass for the soldier-dead of the Falcons and of the parish and for deceased members Sunday morning.

The banquet speakers table was headed by an artistically adorned stage with a backdrop of deep purple displaying the outstanding dates in the life of the organization, 1908-1948. Prominently displayed were the national emblems of America and of Poland and they were centered by the colors of the American Legion. Seated on the stage was Prof. Frank Cleala and president, which played during the banquet and provided the entertainment for the numbers by the large Falcon-Oleo Club American and Polish folk songs and popular numbers.

Toastmaster Stanley S. Krawczyk called the huge assemblage to its feet at 8:30 for the singing of the Polish national anthem and "God Bless America" which were followed by the invocation by Rev. Stanley Moronczko assistant pastor of St. Hyacinth's Church. A toast befitting the occasion was delivered by Chief Peter Bonnerbach and staff. A bevy of the Falcon youth training, not only for the boys but for the girls, while he stated his present delinquency and vandalism in the Polish community.

Cleveland (NC) — Too few adults are willing to give up a little time to organization and guidance of youth groups, the Rev. Charles E. He spoke at an institute on youth sponsored by the Cleveland Diocesan Council of Catholic Women and the Catholic Youth Organization. The NCWC, official Catholic college graduates "are thinking their duty by not taking more active part in the life around them" and that Catholic youth is being influenced by the neopaganism which surrounds them.

"Homes are no longer the center of family life," he asserted.

Priest Discusses Third Commandment

Chicago — (NC) — "Prayer and righteous living by the great numbers of common people can actually change the face of the earth," said Rev. Francis C. Young, pastor of St. John's Church, here, in a discourse on the Third Commandment of the Air radio program, broadcast nationally by the Columbia Broadcasting System.

Father Young spoke on "The Third Commandment" in the current CBS series of discourses dealing with the Ten Commandments. "How happy all of us common people must be," Father Young said, "that God in His goodness, wisdom and providence has given us at least one day of rest each week. Many of our Catholics in the observance of the Third Commandment are not satisfied just to assist at Mass and receive Holy Communion. Many return to the church later in the day to commune quietly, and in peace with Christ, hallowed in our tabernacles."
