**Four Masses Climax
Silver Jubilee of

The 13 young men of the parish who made the supreme sacrifice in World War II were remembered at a Solemn Requiem Mass offered by the pastor on Tuesday. A Solemn Mass of the St. Ambrose School children was celebrated Wednesday morning.

In celebrating the Diamond Jubilee of Nazareth Academy, on Dec. 4, 7 and 8, girls of yesterday, who walked or rode in carriages to the old Academy building on Jay St., corner of Frank will join with girls of the later years who walked or rode in automobiles to the present structure on Lake Ave.

Religious services, a school program and an Alumnae reunion at the Lake Ave. Academy will fittingly commemorate the 75th anniversary of the Catholic private high school for girls which was opened in 1871.

Solemn Pontifical Mass celebrating the Jubilee will be offered by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney on Saturday, Dec. 7 at 10 a. m. in Nazareth Academy Auditorium, 1000 Lake Ave. The Mass will be conducted from 3 to 4 p. m. on Sunday, Dec. 8 in the Academy Gymnasium and will be in the nature of an Alumnae reunion.

Three Sisters of St. Joseph formed the first faculty of Nazareth Academy when it opened in 1871 at Frank and Jay St. Elizabeth, Sr. was the former resident of one of the old time Nazareth families when Frank Street was the social center of the city. Sixty girls ranging in classes from the first grade to the second year of high school formed the original registration.

The original property was purchased from John Jay, Jr., Mayor of Rochester in 1884 and Congressman in 1884. From its foundation, the Nazareth Academy has been the center of the Catholic education for Catholic girls in the city.

Members of the Community who had come from Europe were assigned as instructors in French and German. The lay members were called to the faculty in the late twenties and early thirties. They were Mrs. Katherine C. (Mrs.) who later became agent and editor, John Doyle O'Neil, on The Beacon Press, Catholic leading to graduation from Nazareth Academy, and Mrs. Alice Bernauer, a noted pianist who had been instructor.
