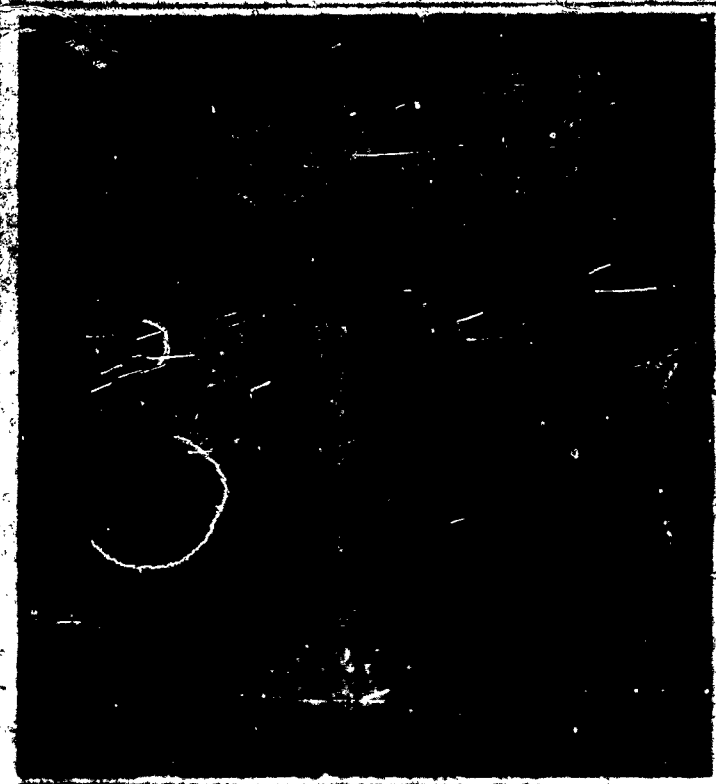


### Catholics in Tokyo Procession

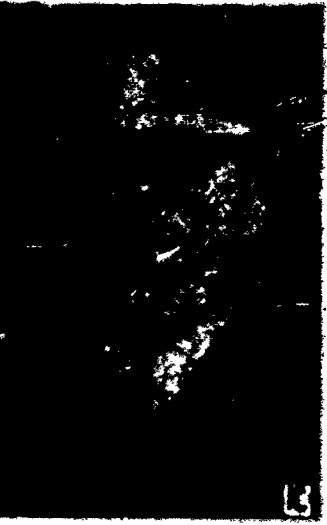

Mahoney of Andover, Mass., both of General Headquarters of the Allied Forces in Japan; Lt. Col. George Hennessy, U.S.N., of Honolulu; Captain Duke of Canada; and Oscar Morrison of the British Legation were among others who participated in carrying the canopy.

### Supreme Court Cites Mann Act In Polygamy

Washington—(NC)—The Mann Act may be invoked in instances involving transportation of plural wives across State lines, the U. S. Supreme Court has ruled in a 5-4 decision which upheld convictions of four members of a sect which undertook to practice polygamy.

The case turned on an interpretation of the phrase "immoral purpose" in the statute. Associate Justice William O. Douglas, who dissented, wrote the majority opinion, acknowledged that while the Mann Act, for almost 20 years, has been enforced primarily against use of interstate commerce for the purpose of transporting women, it is not restricted to that only. He said the court concluded that polygamous practices are not excluded from the act since such practices long have been outlawed by society.

### Whip Housing or Face Chaos, Says Cardinal

Chicago—(NC)—Counseling that the "responsibility for the peace of the world rests upon the stability of the American home," His Eminence Francis Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York, told a dinner-meeting of more than 500 building industry and housing professionals here, that unless fair-play in steam-play are exercised and means about solution of the housing problem, their chaos will run roughshod throughout this nation and over the entire world.

"America must look home-ward," the Cardinal said, "for no nation that cannot solve a problem of its own people, a problem as primary and fundamental as housing, can demonstrate to other nations the logic of its democratic way of life or its right to leadership."

"If we cannot make democracy work at home, what chance have we of demonstrating the superiority of democracy to other nations and its capacity, both at home and abroad, to solve the world's problems? The American way of life is in danger, and unless we, as a nation, can prove America is united and not a house divided against itself, we are doomed to decay, defeat and disaster."

**Peace Work Results**  
The Cardinal speaking before the National Committee on Housing, said that the housing problem is not only a national problem, but a world problem. He said that the American people must turn to the practice of the Golden Rule — each man humbly to live in love and service to God and to his neighbor.

### Cardinal Aids Jews With Al Smith Fund

**Msgr. Tiso Counts On 113 Counts**  
Prague—(NC)—Members of the staff of the Public Prosecutor at Bratislava have completed the drafting of the long predicted and constantly delayed indictment of Msgr. Joseph Tiso, former president of the wartime Slovak State. It has become known here.

The 200-page indictment charges Monsignor Tiso and two of his former ministers, with having committed no less than 113 offenses, each of which is subject to the death penalty under the decree adopted by the Slovak National Council in Bratislava.

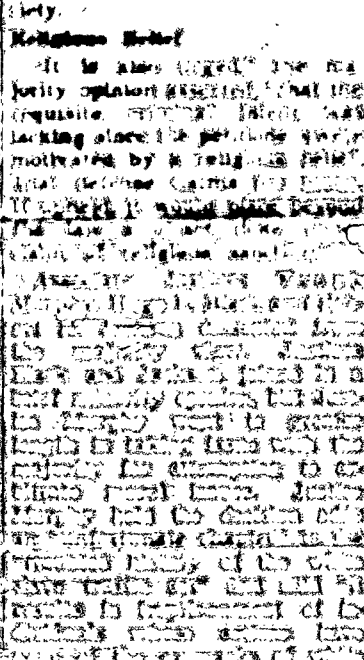
**Leads Action in Canada**

### Bombed Catholic Press Center to Reopen in Tokyo
