The 40th annual sale of Christmas Seals officially opened Monday, Nov. 25, in Monroe County when 23,000 families received three Health Seals in Monday's mail. This year's Seal bears the likeness of an old lamp lighter fighting his lamp against a starry blue sky, symbolic of returning hope.

Centered in each sheet are four special Seals featuring the

four persons who made outstanding contributions to the first Seal Sale in 1907—Jacob Ritz, Danish-born American writer; article about the Christmas Seal and its origin in Denmark; inspired Miss Emily Bissell to use it as a means to obtain funds to help tuberculous patients in Brandywine, Delaware and who, in turn, was aided in the project by E. A. Van Valkenburg, newspaper publisher and editor, and Leigh Mitchell Hodges, newspaper columnist.
