The St. Vincent Ferrer boys choir of 60 voices, under the direction of Constantino Von, honorary organist of the Vatican, will sing Christmas carols.

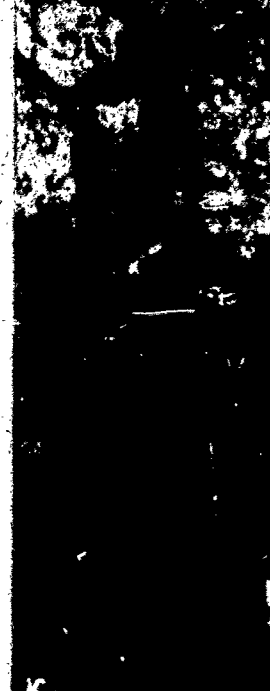
Holiday Party Listed At Holy Family Hall
