

Army Honors NC War Correspondent

Washington (NC) — Burke Walsh, Assistant Director of the N. C. W. C. News Service, was one of those correspondents of World War II to whom Secretary of War Robert P. Patterson presented Army campaign

ribbons and certificates of appreciation at a dinner here. Ribbons were conferred on 50 war correspondents at the dinner by Mr. Walsh, correspondent for the N. C. W. C. News Service from Africa, the Mediterranean area, France and England and was one of the first to enter Rome upon the liberation of the Eternal City by American troops in 1944.

Post Backs CWV Resolution on Abp. Stepinac

Forty-two veterans of Our Lady of Mount Carmel parish have endorsed a resolution to be adopted nationally by the Catholic War Veterans recommending action by the United Nations in the case of Archbishop Alojz Stepinac of Zagreb, Yugoslavia.

The endorsement was signed by a strong turnout of the members of Mount Carmel Post No. 1017, Catholic War Veterans at a recent meeting.

Rev. Edward A. Shannon, chaplain of the post, outlined the stand taken by the national veterans' organization in the document signed by National Commander Max H. Sorenson.

Addressed to the Honorable Warren A. Austin, chief of the U. S. Delegation to the United Nations, the recommendations of the C. W. V. commander are based on the recently-passed UN resolution which would outlaw religious and racial persecution in the world.

Urges UN Action
The veterans' statement pays tribute to the resolution and calls upon members of the assembly to apply its intent to "correcting the present religious persecution in Yugoslavia, which is in complete disregard of the Four Freedoms, the Yalta Declaration, and now the resolution of the General Assembly of the United Nations."

Recalling the statements of "responsible Jewish leaders" in defense of the convicted Yugoslavian Archbishop relating the charges against him, the C. W. V. document states:
"They also relate many tales of his protection of Jewish people, particularly the aged and the children. All were acts against the Nazi invaders which were punishable by the vanquished despoilers of freedom, but surely not punishable by those whose freedom victorious arms secured."

The statement of Acting Secretary of State Dean Acheson that the "actual conduct of the trial left a great deal to be desired" is cited.

Referring to the imprisoned Archbishop as "a man without a country," the C. W. V. protest concludes:
"Therefore we submit it behooves the right thinking, fair-minded, freedom loving representatives to United Nations, to provide freedom for this distinguished prelate of the Roman Catholic Church."

"This confiscation of his property, is the confiscation of Church property, which is definitely religious persecution. As the representative of all God fearing Americans regardless of their personal religious beliefs, we urge you to take action to right this wrong."

Individual members of the Mount Carmel veterans' organization agreed to direct wires, letters and postcards to Senator Austin endorsing, as individuals, the position taken by Commander Sorenson.

The action constituted the first act of the newly formed C. W. V. Post in the defense of civil liberties.
Nominations of candidates for the various offices of the Post were also made at this meeting. Elections will be held at the next meeting in Mt. Carmel auditorium Dec. 16. Those elected will become the first permanent group of officers for the Post.
