**COUSIN OFFERS REQUIEM FOR JOEIN McMILLEN**

Corning — The Rev. Gervase McMullen, O. F. M., of Brookline, Mass., formerly of Corning, celebrated the Requiem Mass in St. Mary's Church for his cousin, John Paul McMullen, who was fatally injured in an automobile accident Sunday, Nov. 24 in the cemetery where the Rt. Rev. James J. Griffin, pastor emeritus of St. Mary's, the Rev. John A. Smith, pastor, the Rev. Joseph McCarthy, assistant pastor, the Rev. Francis Birrol of Bloomingburg, Pa., the Rev. John J. DiBlasio, Bloomingburg, and the Rev. Peter Jankowski of St. Catherine's Church, Addison.

John Paul McMullen, son of Mrs. William H. McMullen Sr., of 78 E. Cornell St., and the late Mr. McMullen, was a popular young athlete, physical education director and coach at Waverly High School. He was born in Corning and attained fame as a basketball player at Corning Free Academy and Syracuse University.

Besides his mother he is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Lynne Cooper of Corning and Mrs. Margaret Heins of Jersey City, N. J.; four brothers, William H. McMullen Jr., Corning, Dr. James J. McMullen, Mansfield, Pa., Dr. A. P. McMullen, Bloomingburg, Pa., and Bernard McMullen of Elmira; several nieces and nephews. Burial was in St. Mary's Cemetery.

Emilio Agosto, 62, of 237 W. Erie Ave., died Tuesday, Nov. 26, at his home following a short illness. He was born in Italy, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Agosto and came to America in 1903. He and Miss Anna Costantino of Lilly, Pa., were united in marriage in 1913. He came to Corning to live in 1912. He was a member of St. Mary's Church and of the Victor Emmanuel III Lodge of Lilly, Pa.

In addition to his wife Mrs. Agosto he is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Joseph A. Paulina and Mrs. Eugene Howard, both of Corning; two sons, Orlando V. Agosto of Corning and Francis D. Agosto of Lilly; two grandchildren; two brothers, Vincenzo and Enrico of Italy; several nieces and a niece.

Funeral services were held Saturday from the home at 8:15 a. m. and at 9 o'clock in St. Mary's Church, Burial was in St. Mary's Cemetery.

**Mary Sheehan Heads State Teachers Unit**

Miss Mary A. Sheehan, vice-principal at Rochester's Monroe High School and a parish member of the Pro-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart, is the new president of the New York State Teachers Association.

Her election to the post took place last week at the annual meeting of the Association in New York City. She will serve for a one-year term.

The oldest and largest teachers organization in the world, the New York Association was founded in 1845 and now numbers 45,000 members, exclusive of New York City whose teachers are not members.

The association is dedicated to "promote interest in education, to advance standards of the teaching profession, to secure conditions necessary for the greatest efficiency of teachers and schools, and to provide non-contradictory aid and relief to needy members of the teaching profession."

Corning — The Rev. Edward McKay, assistant pastor, was celebrant of the solemn high mass offered on Thanksgiving Day in St. Vincent de Paul's Church in thanksgiving to Almighty God for the safe return of nearly 200 young men and women of the parish. Participating in the service were servicemen from their home towns: They were: Greenhouse, Gordon, Schuchman, Merriam, Johnson, First Master of Corning, Joseph (Rochester Navy); Corning: Joseph Mahoney, Navy; and Acosta, Richard Dwyer, and Anthony Russo, both of the Navy.

An impressive procession preceded the Mass in which more than 75 children of the lower grades of St. Vincent de Paul's School took part. Leading them were Patrick Brady and Anthony Latta, both former members of the U. S. Army, serving the First Marine and the Amer. 10th Div.

Twenty boys and girls in white, carrying Good Will banners, led the procession from the parish who gave their lives in service. Special music was provided by St. Vincent's girls choir.

**150 Priests at Pontifical Rites for Father Meagher**

A large throng of clergy and laity crowded Our Lady of Good Counsel Church on Friday morning to pay a final tribute to the Rev. Edward T. Meagher, founder of the Brooks Avenue church and its pastor for the past eighteen years. Priests in attendance numbered 150.

Father Meagher died in St. Mary's Hospital Monday, Nov. 28, 1934, following a short illness. Heading the large turnout of mourners at the Solemn Pontifical Mass of Requiem on Friday morning were His Excellency Bishop James E. Kearney, who celebrated the Mass, and His Excellency Walter A. Fort, Bishop of Syracuse and classmate of the deceased pastor.

The Rev. Leo V. Smith, spiritual director of St. Bernard's Seminary and also a classmate of Father Meagher, delivered the eulogy at the conclusion of the Mass and extolled his friend's priestly charity, and his devotion to the cause of the Church.
