

Rites for Dr. James Flynn, X-Ray Specialist Conducted

Funeral services for Dr. James M. Flynn, roentgenologist and past president of the New York State Medical Society, were conducted Tuesday morning, Dec. 17, 1946 in Blessed Sacrament.

Dr. Flynn died here Saturday, Dec. 14, at St. Mary's Hospital at the age of 53.

Rev. Thomas F. Connors celebrated the Requiem Mass. Final absolution was given by Bishop James J. Conboy.

A native of Rochester, Dr. Flynn became a baseball player and later an umpire before he entered medicine. While attending school in Rochester he spent his spare time on sandlots, from which spring many professional baseball players and two renowned umpires, Bill Klem of the National League and Bill O'Dougherty of the American League.

Contract with National

Dr. Flynn found his ideal in Klem and followed him into the national game. For a year he was manager of the team in the old Inter-State League and then umpire in the South, Middle West and on the Pacific Coast.

He had a contract from John D. Heyder to umpire in the National League when he suddenly decided to take up medicine. He studied at Lake Forest University while working on the West Coast, and was graduated from the University of Buffalo Medical School in 1914. He opened office here that fall.

Dr. Flynn joined the army in the first World War and went overseas in 1918 to serve fourteen months as captain and head of the X-ray department of Base Hospital 18 at Vichy, France. After his return to Rochester, he resumed practice as an X-ray specialist. He was on the staff of five local hospitals.

Before his election to the State Medical Society office in 1940, Dr. Flynn had been president of the Monroe Medical Society, Rochester Pathological Society and Rochester Academy of Medicine. He was fellow of the American College of Physicians, American College of Radiology and Royal Faculty of Radiologists of England. He was a diplomat on the American Board of Radiology and a member of the American Medical Association, Roentgen Ray Society and Radiological Society of North America.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Mae Linnehan Flynn, 12 Vick Park St.; four daughters, Madame Jose of the Order of the Sacred Heart, Tarrytown, N. Y.; Mrs. William St. Paul of Scarsdale, N. Y.; the Misses Margaret and Nancy Flynn and one son, James E. Flynn, all of Rochester; two brothers, Thomas and Joseph Flynn of Miami, Fla., and a grandson, William St. Paul.

His brother was the late Rt. Rev. Magr. William Flynn, director of the Marquette League aiding Indian and Negro missions.
