As heirs of the brilliant social philosophy of the modern Popes Catholics should be in the vanguard of those who work to build a just economic order in the United States.

Surely it would be a step in the right direction if Catholics to management and Catholics in labor would unife to carry into action in American industrial life the social teaching of the

Church. And it can be done. Every Sunday we see Catholic employers and Catholic workers kneeling shoulder to

shoulder around the same altars, professing the same faith, and joining in the same wor.
