Ukrainian Veterans Organize CWV Post

Veterans of the St. Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Church, Elmira Heights, met December 16, to organize a Catholic War Veterans Post. A special meeting was held Dec. 15,

in the Church Auditorium, and the members selected the same. The Elmira Heights group will apply to the Catholic War Veterans, Inc. for a charter.

Named after two members of the parish who were killed in action, William E. Fesbich on Guam, and Andrew Macek on Leyte, the post has 40 members. St. Nicholas Church had 150 members in the armed forces.

At the organization meeting, Stephen J. Anderson was elected Commandant; Paul S. Obuchanich, adjutant; Michael Beach, treasurer; Alexander N. Speen, William Simon and Peter Kurys, trustees. The Rev.
