New York—(NC)—Hundreds of thousands of British and Polish Ukrainians in displaced person camps are to be subjected to an intense "repatriation program" to bring about their "voluntary" return to their Soviet-dominated homelands.

### Stroke Halts Belloc's Pen

London—(NC)—Eliane Belloc, one of the most famous living British Catholic authors, who is now 78 years old, will probably never write again, according to her friend, the Rev. Harold Roper, M.A., who has visited the distinguished writer at his rural home in Berkshire, Sussex.

Mr. Belloc, who has spent four months in bed after a stroke, is recovering and is able to move slowly. His mind remains active. Father Roper said.

## ANTI-CLERICISM CAMPAIGN HIT

Rome—(NC)—A resolution strongly deprecating the recent anticlerical campaign in Italy as "offending the sentiment of the entire nation" and as "trampling upon the elementary rights of an entire class of well-deserving people" was passed by central and diocesan heads of all the Catholic Action organizations in Italy.

The presidents of the various Catholic Action groups drew up the resolution at a special session called by the President General of the Italian Catholic Action to deal with the campaign.

New York—(NC)—Back from a trip to Europe, including a visit to Vatican City, while on a quest for material for his third annual volume, "Best Sermons, 1947 Edition," G. Paul Butler, editor, has announced that some pronouncements by His Holiness Pope Pius XII will be contained in his newest work. Mr. Butler was received by the Holy Father during his visit to the Vatican.

## N. Y. Police Send President's Refugee Camp Brief on Tito Persecution Closes; Aided 1,434

New York—(NC)—A petition calling for three-fold action by the United States with regard to the persecutions of Catholics in Yugoslavia has been published in the form of a legal brief and forwarded to President Truman by the Holy Name Society of the Police Department of the City of New York.

The President is petitioned first, to make a statement disavowing any support, recognition or ratification of the government of the United States for the atrocities committed by the Yugoslav government; second, to instruct the U. S. Ambassador in Yugoslavia to protest to the Yugoslav government its acts and atrocities against Catholics and their leader, Archbishop Stejpanac; and third, to instruct the American U. N. representative to have the matter brought to the attention of that body for appropriate international action.

## China's Hierarchy Formally Established

Nanking—(Radio, NC)—The Apostolic Constitution for China, setting up a Hierarchy for that country, was formally promulgated on New Year's Day when Archbishop Antonio Riberi, Apostolic Internuncio to China, conferred the pallium upon Archbishop Paul Yu Pin of Nanking at the Cathedral here.

## Bishops Score Sect's Move

Quebec—(NC)—The "archival sources" of the Jehovah's Witnesses were criticized by the bishops of Quebec, which refused to recognize that the Jehovah's Witnesses are a religious sect.

The bishops' statement was issued at the residence of the Cardinal-Archbishop of Quebec. The statement reads: "In September, 1946, when we learned that the Jehovah's Witnesses of the Province of Quebec had been declared a religious sect by the Government of Quebec, we were shocked and informed the civil authorities to this effect."
