

"During my sojourn abroad I have realized the monstrosity of the lies spread in the Soviet Union about 'the beastly exploitation of workers in the capitalist countries.' Such stories are told the Russian people for the purpose of arousing their indignation against the democratic regime

of the U.S.A. "All my life I have loyally worked for the Russian peoole whom I leve, and to whom my attachment is very deep. But it has become cle . to me that my work, like that of the vhole Russian people, is beneficial to the Soviet regime, and

not to themselves. "No nation is more explait-Soviet nation.
